#### Reaching Your Plateau!

Recently I've had a number of clients say to me that they seem to have hit a plateau in their progress. Don't worry about it, EVERYONE plateaus at some stage and it can be addressed quite easily.

Most times, people who don't think they are getting results actually ARE. The only way to know for sure is to take girth measurements in a Fitness Assessment. A good Trainer will be able to take you out of your comfort zone, advise you on varying your workouts and motivate you to change your body, diet and overall lifestyle.


Different people have different appetites, metabolic rates and tolerance for exercise. You need to find the balance that works for YOU. The first step is to properly assess your

On recent Sunday evenings Royal Perth's emergency department resembles a minor war zone. Beside the Motor Vehicle Accident victims are:

teenagers streaked with blood, girls crying, open stab wounds and torn clothes. At least one of them appears next morning (Monday) in the 7th Floor Eye Clinic with bruised face and traumatised eyes.

Take 17 year old dry cleaning worker, Angela, as an example. She was blind in her right eye, could not judge stairs or the position of furniture. Her mother was away on a 'business trip' but Angela had to be sent home to give her bruises time to reduce. Three weeks later she was reassessed and found to be long-sighted (small diameter eye balls) totally dependent on internal eye muscles to obtain focus. Her abuser could not have foreseen

that the abuse delivered to Angela's head would have paralysed those eye muscles and cause a clot on the macula of the right eye. Apparently he thought a 'bit of concussion would serve her right.' A moderately strong spectacle lens gave her 20% vision.

Half a binocular (a monocular) magnified the visual image larger than the clot, and she could then see 83%! However it was impossible to walk wearing half a binocular (the large retinal image would not match the left eye's normal size picture) and Angela began crying again as the abuse had also reduced her left eye muscles to a 10% loss of vision.

Her employer considered she was now a danger in his steam and chemical industry so asked her to take her vacation, get powered safety spectacles, learn to do some tasks left handed (to match the better vision in her left eye) and obtain another assessment to see if she could remain employed.

The eye clinic has told Angela that contact lenses do not help this type of trauma. Angela must now live with the effects of her abuse.



Dear Mrs Drew

I understand that it is difficult for some when areas that they thought would always stay rural change to urban.

The areas you are referring to on Brookton Highway were identified many years ago (I believe in the 60's) under the Stephenson Planning scheme suitable for urban development.

The orchard you are referring to on Holden Road has been zoned for urban development since the early 90's. A development was approved for that area quite a few years ago but for whatever reasons did not proceed. I am sure the proposed development will be of good quality and an asset to our community. Officers are working with the developer to ensure that a lovely stand of large gum trees on the site will become open space for the development.

The Borg Orchard land opposite that you referred to was zoned urban about the same time. While you may not appreciate the pole homes, given the steep terrain of the site and the constraints involved with developing there, they are the best design for the site. The land where you now live was once zoned rural, but under an urban

zoning has proven to be a delightful area for families to live.



Roleystone is and always will be a beautiful place to live and be a part of. Even if, in the future, you may have to look a little further for the orchards.





#### Roleystone Personality Tony Arena

Tony Arena, this month's 'Local Personality', is representative of the hundreds of first generation Italian immigrants throughout our community, especially those on the orchards of Karragullen.

They all worked hard and most prospered with their names now spread across Karragullen and Roleystone. Their contribution to the establishment, development orchard. No power, no fridge and and growth of our area is immeasurable.

Antonio Arena was born in Melicucca, Reggio, Calabria – a region in the poor southern tip of Italy. His birth on the 20th June 1940 was into a nation embroiled in war, in fact Tony remembers the German soldiers passing through his village as a young child wanting to trade bread for olives. His grandfather had already immigrated to Australia (he spent the war interred on his own orchard in Karragullen providing food for the war effort) and was separated from the

family – including his wife, over this time. Tony's grandmother joined her husband on his Karragullen orchard after the war.

At 14 (in 1954) Antonio was determined to 'go for a holiday' to visit his Nonno and Nonna. He went in luxury; he had a first class ticket and really enjoyed the trip over. His protective parents had provided the young lad with a chaperone, however she was seasick for the whole 21-day journey so Tony had great freedom on the boat. He had very few words of English and thanks to the family he shared meals with on the trip, arrived in Australia knowing words like knife, fork, bread and sugar but otherwise he understood very little English.

Once in Australia he went to work for his grandparents. He was initially very unimpressed! He had dreamed of far greater luxury and advancement than was to be seen on the Karragullen no electricity - hardly the 'land of opportunity' he had dreamt of!

He soon branched out to other work, picking beans and digging up potatoes for Sebastian Ghilarducci with a horse and plough. He then worked with Jack O'Meagher on his Karragullen timber mill and he enjoyed working with timber. He found Jack to be a 'real gentleman' and he paid well, so the young Tony settled in to work in this industry for many years. He worked all week at the mill and on the weekends helped with the orchard, with only Sunday afternoons off. He remembers that everyone (Italian and non Italian alike) mixed in well and thoughts of returning to Italy soon faded. He fondly remembers dances (those Karragullen Barn Dances were special) and sometimes went further a field to Pickering Brook and to the Italian Club in Perth. He joined in with a range of sports; initially soccer and later Tony became a very talented badminton player.

On the Friday before he was 18, Tony went to Kelmscott to do his driving test. He passed and when the policeman asked him for proof of age and he said 'my birthday is tomorrow' – the policeman was not impressed! He had to sit the whole test again on the Monday. He had to do a hill start on gravel and because he didn't spin the wheels he was given his licence.

At 18 years of age Tony had moved to the Kelmscott saw mill owned by Joe, Peter and Louie Ghilarducci (later Mazzegas and now Colli and sons) when tragedy struck. Tony had been clearing the area and made a misjudgement and his hand was struck by the saw, severing his middle three fingers. The doctor responsible for repairing the hand 'totally botched the operation' and had to cut more and more off the fingers until only

stumps remained. When he told Tony that he recommended another operation Tony threatened him with an inkbottle and the doctor got the hint that no more operations would be happening! Tony received a paltry £400 pay out for the disability.

He was only 19 years old and the injury hit him hard - he lost confidence and for some time he found working very difficult. It took him many years to recover and for some time he was very depressed about his life. He joined with Mario Scaravilli, Mick and Rocco Saffiotti and they went land clearing – this was onerous work but paid well and he soon had significant savings. In 1966 he put a £50 deposit down on the Karragullen Garage (now the Gull) as he fancied himself as a garage owner. At this time his grandparents wanted to return to Italy and asked him if he would take over the orchard. He was reluctant but agreed so that they could leave the farm. It was certainly a different era then as the seller of the Garage thought this was a 'noble act' and refunded him his full

Young Tony was now an orchard owner and in need of some help. His sister came out from Italy to help out but she was here for less than a year before she met up and married a Mundijong dairy farmer.

In March 1968 Antonio was heading down to Donnybrook to go hunting with a friend. They detoured though Collie and the friend spotted his cousins. This was when Tony first laid eyes on 'a most beautiful Italian girl' and asked to be introduced. Almerina had only just arrived from Southern Italy. Tony declared that it was love at first sight. Tony worked fast; he was soon down meeting with her father and they married in October. Poor Almerina thought she was going to have an 'easy life' in Australia but arriving at the orchard just before stone fruit season this was never going to happen.

The young couple have worked hard on the orchard. They have raised their family of three boys: Annunziato (Nunzi), Frank and Anthony and now have five adored grandchildren. Two of the boys have pursued careers in other areas but middle son Frank has stayed on the orchard helping it to remain as a competitive force in the current cut throat world of orcharding.

The final word comes from son Frank: 'I thank my father so much for coming out. The opportunities in this country for me and my brothers and our kids are huge.'

My parents have worked so hard and have given us a wonderful life'.

This sentiment goes to all of the immigrants who have helped build great lives for their children in this area, they have also built and enriched our community.

The theme was World Music



Now with this hideous steel fence preventing room for a swerve option, this will doom cars to a 'head on' or end up with a thousand dollars of steel sitting in your lap. I suppose only time will tell if this 'safety fence' really lives up to its name.

#### The Desecration at Canning Mills

I was saddened when I went out to Canning Mills last week.

This is a significant and important site for the Roleystone Karragullen community.

It was a major turn of the century population centre with the development of the timber mill and at its peak had over 1000 inhabitants. A school, inn store and railway station all provided great facilities for the early inhabitants.

But the mill moved south as the supply of big timber diminished and many of the inhabitants moved with the mill or into the surrounding areas.

My memories of this site are of a peaceful area encircled by natural bush, with tall stands of ancient pine trees, groves of wattles and cleared areas.

A poignant memory is of the picket fence encircled grave marking the untimely passing of a small infant to one of the insidious, turn of the century illnesses.

Sadly my memories were assaulted on my recent visit. Piles of household and industrial junk and evidence of 4-wheel drive activity crisscrossed the area. The grave has disappeared under the rubble.

I was aghast. Is this how we deal with our sacred historic sites?

I contacted the environmental officer at the Shire of Kalamunda who did not know where Canning Mills was but did promise to look into it

This is our history and our heritage and I encourage others to take a visit to this site and if you too feel aggrieved by what you see, make your feelings known.

#### The Future Fate of the Old Sugar Gum

Concerned residents met with Main Roads WA representatives on Tuesday  $23^{rd}$  September to discuss the fate of a sugar gum tree located near the intersection of Peet Road and Brookton Highway.

In addition, Main Roads took the opportunity to advise residents and stakeholders of works proposed in the vicinity of the intersection.

The sugar gum, which is in the Brookton Highway road reserve, was identified as a hazard during independent road safety audits conducted in 2003 and 2008.

During the meeting, Joe Rapattoni, Main Roads' Project Development Officer explained that the audits were commissioned in response to safety concerns raised by local residents that the tree interferes with sight lines.

As the tree is not native to WA and is not in an environmentally sensitive area, approval to remove it was granted in September 2004. In December 2004 Main Roads' Contractors were on-site and in the process of removing the tree when community members intervened, halting the work.

Main Roads commissioned independent facilitators, Estill & Associates to arrange and facilitate the meeting. As well as representatives of Main Roads and the City of Armadale, the meeting was attended by community group members and local residents, most of

whom oppose the removal of the tree.

Since 2004, Main Roads has conducted much research including heritage and arboricultural assessments, which suggest that the life of the tree is limited to 10-20 years and that aggressive pruning over the years has diminished its aesthetic appeal and increased the risk of limb shedding. Crash statistics report 8 vehicle crashes between 2002 and 2006 including one where a vehicle hit the tree.

Main Roads' Project Development Manager, Gary Manning said "Main Roads has no interest in removing trees, but we do have a duty of care to all road users."

"Most vehicles travelling from Peet Road actually pass the stop line and enter the Brookton Highway roadway to check for oncoming vehicles, creating a potentially dangerous situation," Mr Manning said.

"What we are trying to balance is the community's emotional attachment to the tree with our duty to all road users. Safety is a paramount consideration," he said.

Most participants attending the meeting stated a preference to complete planned earthworks west of the intersection initially, monitor crash statistics following the works and seek further community comment. Other participants felt that in addition to the western earthworks, the tree should be removed to improve road safety at the intersection.

The meeting was constructive and collaborative and ended with a commitment from Main Roads to evaluate the options discussed and report back to the group.

#### GARDENING NOTES JEAN

It is incredible how quickly September has sped by. Now the gardens are starting to colour up and we are all thinking of barbecues and picnics or just spending more of our daylight hours outside.

The idea of 'garden rooms' is often mentioned in gardening columns. In Victorian days it was fashionable to have areas hidden by hedges with discreet private areas where chaste young ladies could wander. The chaperone would be close at hand but not able to pry or interfere.

but the quirky artistic side shows out beautifully in her garden.



supply of native plants indigenous to these local areas. My purchases included: Cassia, Patersonias, and Conostylis.

I also couldn't resist a black red hybrid Tea Rose called 'Shadow', and also an old fashioned Tea Rose 'Mrs Herbert Stephens' a lovely pure white.

Just a word of caution if you are putting in seedlings. Remember that some sort of snail deterent is needed. If you are not into chemicals, beer in a bottle tipped on its side will give them a happy farewell. Crushed egg shell, zeolite or sawdust scattered around discourage them from crawling towards your precious seedlings.



The Kelmscott Annual Show is in its 110th year and is celebrating this milestone with the 2008 theme of 'Frogs'.

The theme was inspired by Amphibian Ark's "2008 Year of the Frog" global campaign with the objective of raising awareness of the amphibian extinction crisis and educating people on ways they can prevent this problem.

It is a long-term project, which aims to breed selected species of amphibians in captivity and release them into the wild securely. Perth is native to 16 species of frogs but due to wetland destruction and pollution, their numbers are decreasing.

#### Vaccinating your Pet Dr Judith Congrene

Regular vaccinations for your pets will assist to prevent the common viral diseases that are a serious threat to your dog or cat's health. Theses diseases are often fatal and are very contagious. The viral nature of these diseases means that there is no cure and the attempts to treat the symptoms can be very costly, both financially and emotionally. This is definitely a case of "Prevention is better than cure".

In Australia the major viral diseases that affect dogs are Canine Parvovirus, Canine Distemper and Canine Hepatitis. Canine Cough (Kennel Cough) is another disease that has a viral component.

There are 3 major cat diseases caused by viruses that are highly infectious and cause serious illness, even death. These diseases are Feline Infectious Enteritis, Feline Respiratory Disease ('Cat flu') and

#### Letter to the Editor : Right of Reply

I have been dismayed by the emotive and sometimes very personal comments directed at me by the supporters of the current management of Araluen. (I am very careful to draw a point of difference between supporters of Araluen, of which I consider myself to be and the supporters of the current style of management at Araluen.) So let me indulge in the same kind of emotive arguments but balanced with fact.

Let me clearly state again – I have concern about the vision, decision making and management style of the current management structure at Araluen, not with Araluen as an entity itself.

I am concerned about the attacks on our Council and Councillors, our elected representatives, all of whom unanimously voted against the street parking - not just Cr Hart - who are being attacked and blamed for the shortcomings of the current management.

I am concerned for the risk to our community/ratepayers and the natural amenity of the park especially in light of events and ideas that seem to have no point of difference with other festivals in other areas and no connection with unique and special environment that is Araluen. These ideas include roman ruins and at one stage an idea by Mr Colwill for a water theme park complete with water slides come to mind.

For the record I have a close affinity with Araluen. Like many other children I enjoyed many picnics there without bands, festivals and hoo-ha, but great times regardless. I was married at Araluen; my parents and many friends are volunteers at Araluen and friends of mine have worked there over the years.

Araluen was born of a vision by Boss JJ Simons as monument to the Young Australia League's motto for good citizenship, "Love, Service and Tolerance". It's a shame that some representatives of Araluen have shown such disrespect by pushing the tolerance levels of the local community and failing to engage with our elected council representatives in a proactive and mutually beneficial way.

I take umbrage at the comments that "Greenies like myself should support Araluen for the work they do with Flora and Fauna". When our many under funded and under resourced and mainly volunteer land care groups get the same amount of Government support as Araluen does then Araluen will get my kudos, although planting exotic unsustainable species does not have my support. This is my own personal viewpoint and as a gardener I can appreciate the beauty of all plant species especially those that are indigenous and in empathy with our surrounds.

I have also been challenged about my understanding of events and volunteers. I have worked damned hard in my community for many, many years as a volunteer. The work done in Cross Park is just one of the many projects I have been involved with. I also work in the not for profit sector and have worked as a volunteer support officer and events coordinator so please stop bleating at me of a lack of understanding of volunteer values and how hard it is to run a not for profit organisation.

Some seem to think that I had no empathy with Senior Citizens visiting the park. When I was looking for venues that my seniors activity group and disability group could visit, Araluen was too expensive and inaccessible for wheelchairs – especially the train where there is no motorised wheelchair access. Instead we were welcomed in the Swan Valley where we were spoiled for choice of venues, surrounded by beautiful gardens and where with no entry fee we could enjoy our picnics, tea and scones.

I stand by my original comments that

#### Greek Yoghurt Dip (Tztkiki) This makes 2 cups!

**Ingredients:** 1 cup cucumber- diced, 1 cup low fat plain yoghurt, black pepper, 1 clove garlic- crushed, juice of ½ lemon, 1 tbsp mint- chopped.

**Do it:** Mix all ingredients together. Serve with curries, spicy dishes, meatballs or serve as a dip with Turkish bread or slices of vegetables -enjoy.

#### **Golden Syrup Dumplings**

**Ingredients:** 1 ½ cups of self raising flour, ½ cup ground almonds, 60g softened butter, 1 egg- lightly beaten, ¼ cup milk, 1 cup water, ¾ cup caster sugar, ¾ cup golden syrup, 1 tbsp brandy or rum (optional), 30 g butter.

**Do it:** Sift flour, add almonds, rub in butter with fingertips until mixture looks like breadcrumbs. Add milk, mix to a firm dough. Roll small pieces of dough to form walnut size dumplings (they swell to 2-3 times when cooked). Place water, sugar, golden syrup, brandy/rum and butter in a pan, stir over low heat until butter has melted then bring to the boil. Gently drop dumplings into simmering syrup, cover and cook for 10 minutes without lifting the lid. Serve dumplings with sauce spooned over accompanied by fresh cream – yum.



After a lengthy application process, Roleystone District High School has been granted specialist status in Digital Film and Television.



As far as the Observatory's concerned, October brings a new season: the public star viewing

After the winter lay-off, our evening viewing programme gets into gear again. The October school holidays have something to do with it. Please note that you have to phone up and make a booking on 9293-8255, if you want to come and look through our telescopes. Dress warmly!

With new moon having just occurred (Sep. 29), this month begins with the waxing crescent moon being one of the bright objects that catch the eye. The other is Venus which dominates the western sky at dusk.

The next brightest object is Jupiter, which is almost overhead as you face west at nightfall. It doesn't look very likely at present, but - believe it or not - Jupiter and Venus will be side-by-side on December 1. They're Wanderers. "Planet" means wanderer. They don't stay put among the same star field.

If you're going outside to do a bit of backyard astronomy, check the satellite predictions on:

#### www.heavens-above.com .

The Space Shuttle Atlantis is scheduled to take off on October 10 to make the last servicing mission to the aging Hubble Space Telescope. The Shuttle astronauts will perform maintenance and upgrades designed to

keep Hubble operational until 2014.

It should be possible to see Atlantis and the HST. Check the Heavens-Above website and the Night Sky report on the weather page in the West Australian every Monday for viewing details.

From my standpoint as one of the staff running the Observatory's evening viewing sessions, it's a bit of a pity that we start our public viewings just as the Southern Cross is going out of sight. It comes into view again around 2am, but we don't have public viewings at 2am.

The Cross will always be above the horizon at some time during the night, but not always at a time that suits you. Especially if you have to go to work or school the next day. The simplest way to figure out what's visible when is to get a decent planisphere (star-wheel). It's a star map that can be set up for a chosen date and time, and shows what stars and constellations are above the horizon. Any time, any date. I like planispheres.

The Moon's phases for October are: waxing crescent moon till first quarter on the 7th; waxing gibbous moon till full moon on the night of the 14th-15th; waning gibbous moon till last quarter on the 21st; waning crescent till new moon (no moon) on the 29th. On the 14th the full moon will rise about 20 minutes before sunset.

#### Wild Gossip

T h esound of baby birds can be heard all around Roleystone at present and the parent birds can be seen searching for food to feed their young. We can help the birds by looking carefully

for nests and listening for young before pruning back vines, trimming shrubs or lopping tree branches.

If you find a baby bird on the ground:

Check to see if a nest has become dislodged and if found it should be secured to a nearby tree branch then the baby bird placed back in it. Observe from a distance to ensure that the parent birds continue to care for it.

If the baby bird is unfeathered and no nest can be seen it will need to be placed in an artificial nest that is secured to a nearby branch. Observed from a distance to ensure that the parents continue to care for it.

If the baby bird is feathered it could be on the ground whilst learning to fly and being shown what to eat by the parents, so should be left alone and observed from a distance to see if the parents are in attendance. If the bird is in danger from predators that cannot be temporarily confined the baby bird should be gently picked up and placed on a nearby branch or suitable alternative.

Usually it is not necessary to remove an uninjured bird from its environment. Parent birds teach their young vital survival skills and every effort should be made for them to continue do so.

Never attempt to feed a baby bird unless instructed to do so by a qualified carer as incorrect food can kill.

If in doubt always seek advice from a qualified carer.

Injured birds should be gently picked up and placed in a secure box (small enough to prevent flying attempts & wing damage) with padding beneath - and kept in a dark, quiet place until they can be taken to a wildlife carer or vet.

#### **Comment from the Head Gardener**

Araluen is a very rare place. The combination of good soil, high rainfall, cold winters, and little wind in this north / south valley creates an ideal microclimate to showcase some of the beautiful trees and shrubs we can't normally see in Perth.

It wasn't luck that created this wonderful garden but the foresight of John Joseph Simon who in 1927 went looking for land to create a "Hills Resort" with the following desirable features. (The following taken from the 1927 Araluen, Genesis, Purpose and Development Proposals)

- 1. A fair sized tract of country as nearly as possible in its virgin state.
- 2. A permanent stream of sufficient volume to permit the construction of a large swimming pool, constantly over-flowing.
- A situation within reasonable distance of the city and reached by good roads.
- 4. Attractive scenic approaches and location.
- Adaptability for the purpose of League training and social activities, keeping in mind open air gymnastics, band practices, marching drills, athletic and parade field. Construction of openair stadium.
- 6. Attractive locality for ramblings.
- Seclusion from roads carrying heavy traffic and from residents to whom band exercises may be an annoyance.
- 8. Attractive view, taking a panorama of the surrounding country.

Number 8 is the only heading, which the property does not come up to the standard.

In 1990 Mary Hargreaves and Noelene Drage had the foresight to save Araluen when it appeared Araluen would be sold to overseas investors. They thought that Araluen would make a wonderful botanic park after seeing all the plants that had thrived through the years of neglect since being planted in the 30's and 40's. The Araluen Botanic Park Foundation (ABPF) was formed at a public meeting and they convinced the government to purchase Araluen. Since that day 18 years ago the ABPF have continued the plantings including Tulips started by J J Simons 79 years ago.

Araluen gives visitors and tourists another visitation choice in Perth. Kings Park, the Swan Valley and even the Zoo have concerts and festivals to boost their revenue. I have sat in queues to get to Sandalford's 'Day on the Green' and also at King's Park getting to and from concerts and the Moonlight Movies.

This year Araluen's flowers have looked better than ever and by the visitation numbers have been appreciated by thousands of people. The visitors I like to see in the Park are the elderly brought in by the busloads from nursing homes, retirement villages and hostels. The obvious enjoyment they get from their rides on the train and the beautiful surroundings are a pleasure to see. We work hard to make their day enjoyable and have been recognised with 2 commendations for the 'Accessible Communities Awards'.

Seeing the enjoyment of people choosing to come and see the difference that is 'Araluen' makes working here a pleasure.

#### **Comment from a Volunteer**

Thank you Linda for researching the history, the present, and the proposed future for Araluen Botanic Park, and publishing it for the enlightenment of those not cognisant with the true facts. Also thank you Mike Huff for your contribution

It's a pity complainants in other publications did not establish all these facts, in particular the ownership, instead of criticising park management for holding popular events and not resolving the traffic and parking issue

I have seen the plans for extra parking and entrance at the park's northern boundary proposed by park management about 4 years ago, endorsed, and still waiting funding from the park owners

In the interim, park management with the City of Armadale, established the one-way traffic system to minimise the impact on Croyden Rd residents during the springtime and Chilli Festival.

I am also aware of the disruption previously caused having been invited to a Sunday volunteers lunch, joining a traffic queue in Croyden Rd about 200 metres from Brookton Hwy, and wondering if I would make it before lunch was over (as did a volunteer who lived in the affected area).

The park has a very tight annual budget from the owner and relies on sponsorship, grants, and entrance fees from two annual events to supplement this

It's a know fact that the success of any organisation depends not only on good management but also the constraints placed by the ownership. For example: Dick Smith Electronics, Linfox, Microsoft, Apple Computer, and the former Ansett Airlines, owe their success to Dick, Lindsay, Bill, Steve, and Sir Reg - the original owner/managers.

Let's not berate park management and staff who have achieved awards from the tourist industry. It would be sad to see their efforts nullified and the park returned to it's weed infested overgrown mess before it's rescue by dedicated volunteers and risk takers who prevented it's sale and desecration.

Like a boil on the bum let's hope it has now come to a head; with wounds healed all will be resolved soon.

#### Flight to Freedom

Our local raptor carers, featured in the June edition of The Roleystone Courier, chose a

beautiful sunny Sunday in spring to release their wedge-tailed eagle back into the wild in the Araluen Valley.

The bird had been delivered to them some months before, having suffered a bullet wound to the wing and had gone through a long rehabilitation. Over the last few weeks she was showing signs that she was ready for freedom.

The eagle was released at a local orchard – surrounded on two sides by national park. The area looked perfect for a 'new eagle home'. She immediately spread her wings flying perfectly on the injured wing and after one large circle she found a high dead tree, the perfect vantage point to survey her new location.

Wedge tailed eagles have a territory of 4-5 kilometres but can and do travel large distances before they settle. The decision to release her locally rather than return her to her previous location was based on the carers concern for her welfare – they were worried that she would be shot if she was returned.

Wedge tailed eagles breed for life and she may have already formed a breeding pair bond before she was shot. So she may not be able to find a mate.

The farm owners were keen for her to stay in the valley. The presence of eagles and raptors scares away parrots – naturally.

Sadly since she has been released there has been no further sighting. We think she has been enjoying Springtime at Araluen. We wish her well with her new life.






