October was certainly a month filled with tempestuous emotions. Roleystone lost two of its young men in a horrific car accident in Boddington. Vale Glen Darbyshire and Matt Butcher.

My deepest sympathies are extended to the Butcher and Darbyshire families on their catastrophic loss. The outpouring of grief across town and the widespread effect these deaths had on a number of people was truly testament to their popularity and the impact these two young people had achieved in their short lives.

Sadly the expression of grief did result in some vandalism and malicious damage. While this is not condoned, in the young grief and anger are often intertwined. It is understandable that some in the City of Armadale were not initially impressed however those who interceded and allowed the tank to remain as a shrine for the grieving crowd need to be commended. I feel that the expression at the tank was done well and allowed our young people to progress through the stages of grieving appropriately.

On a personal note my own family was cruelly affected with two other deaths this month from our previous hometown Kalbarri. My son Brett lost his best friend, 'fisherman extraordinaire', Luke Rodger to a car accident and I lost my dearly beloved friend, teacher and 'Mrs Kalbarri' Brenda Brockwell, I remember them both with such fondness and extend my sympathies to their families and another town steeped in the grief that

comes with the loss of the 'far too young'. On a happier note, our town has been bursting

with Spring events and they have all seemed to go without a hitch. The Karragullen Expo, at risk of being abanded due to falling numbers, was a wonderful success.

## October

Locals came out in droves to support it and the day was excellent. The Kelmscott show too went well, although the organisers did report that numbers were slightly down on last year.



My garden was open to the public through the Open Garden Scheme early in the month. It was a very cold, drizzly weekend and I was disappointed that the weather meant the flowers were not out in the blaze of colour that they are today. And on the Saturday I had a 'special visit' from about 1 000 black cockatoos who rained honkey nuts on the last few intrepid visitors. (This meant that I had to get up at 5.30 am on Sunday and rake them all up before the new lot of visitors came). Still overall we had about 220 visitors and I received a real buzz from their comments. (See photos below).

And now November is here and with that all of the summer events. The Rememberance Day Ceremony on the 11th at Araluen will certainly be on my calendar and I hope on your's too. Plus I am also looking forward to the Roleystone Theatre's production of Sound of Music.

Do I get a Home Gym or Join a Real Gym?

# Matt Smailes: Master Farrier

industries or just for the indulged horses of the rich and famous. Matt's passion will ensure that he will join

#### Local Karragullen identity Matt Smailes is forging a very successful career as an internationally respected farrier.

Matt is carrying on the Smailes tradition following father Phillip and grandfather Ken into this ancient trade. However unlike his predecessors, Matt is taking his trade outside the confines of the local area and has dreams of providing farrier services across the world.

Matt left school as a 15 year old and took up an apprenticeship with his dad Phillip on their Karragullen property. Following the completion of his four-year apprenticeship, Matt spent three months in the UK and this experience allowed him to see his craft in a different light. In the UK he learnt that this trade is 'not just about shoeing horses'. There are exciting great possibilities for top class farriers and Matt's experience in the UK allowed him to see what was possible.

He came back to Karragullen to work with Phillip for a short period of time before deciding that he needed to return overseas to allow him to pursue his craft. Thus he went back and studied for three years in England studying with masters, approved farriers, able to guide and shape his development and really enable him to excel in his trade. In the UK only qualified people are able to practice and the qualification must be dual – from the government (an MBQ Level 3) and must also be recognised by the peer organisation of farriers that has existed since 1350.

Matt found that his experience in Australia allowed him to be practically proficient however the oversees experience allowed him to hone his theoretical knowledge. The course was rich in the anatomy and physiology of the horse and encouraged the farrier to look at every individual hoof and plan and develop a shoe to fit the hoof and the horse's lifestyle.

Matt's experience in the UK allowed him to spend time with people who were world-class farriers. He saw where the job could take him and he has been inspired. He met farriers who were flown across the world to shoe horses in high stakes equine

this elite group. Matt has been moving into the highly skilled area of tool creation. Matt's hand crafted, precision tools for the farrier trade are much in demand.

The day I visited, four beautiful prize-winning Clydesdales were being shod. Phillip and Matt meticulously and efficiently shod each horse. Each hoof was treated with care, reverence and a huge amount of understanding and a shoe was fashioned to suit. These magnificent creatures were in the hands of experts and it showed. The owner enthusiastically sung the praises of the two farriers and especially heaped praise on Matt who he declared to be the 'best farrier in Australia'. Strong praise indeed.

The Smailes family have a long tradition in this industry. Phillip's father Ken learnt his craft from early pioneer Dick Knuckey in the 1930's and transferred his knowledge and skills to his son Phillip and who has passed this onto his son Mathew. It is inspirational to think of these ancient skills being transferred down the generations. Matt has taken these skills to a new level having been successful across a range of international competitions.

We wish Matt all the best in taking an ancient art into a very modern future.

# Roleystone Personality Reverend Dr Lesley Borowitzka

This month we are celebrating the contribution of the unassuming Reverend Doctor Lesley Borowitzka – the Anglican Priest of Roleystone and Karragullen. Lesley has packed some impressive achievements into her life. Her most recent role as theologian and spiritual guide of the Anglican diocese, follows on from a highly successful career in the world of scientific research and business.

Lesley is married to Michael Borowitzka – Professor of Marine Phycology at Murdoch University and is the mother of two grown up daughters: Anna, a microbiologist and Kathy, a jeweller.

# Canning Dam

10 Wygonda Road, Roleystone stocpa@iinet.net.au In our own district we are lucky enough to have an icon – Canning Dam, a National Trust classified constuction and truly amazing edifice.

At the time of its construction, Canning Dam was recognised as one of the largest dams in the world and recognised as a major engineering achievement. Its innovative structure as a concrete gravity fed dam was at the forefront of 'concrete dam' design in its day.



It was designed by Adelaide born Sir Russell Dumas (1887 – 1975) and was officially opened by the then Premier of the state the Hon J Wilcock on September  $8^{th}$  1940.

The dam was very significant in the development of our state.

It was essential for the expansion of the

Perth metropolitan area as a reliable water supply was of major importance in making certain that future development was sustainable.

It replaced the old pipe head dam built on the Canning River in 1924.

Prior to the dam's construction Perth's water supply was unreliable and poor in quality (it was quite saline and had an excess of bacterial pollution) and often scarce in drought periods.

At the time it was the State's largest public works project. Also the large area of natural forest in the catchment area has significant



environmental impact and importance.

The site for the dam was selected in 1896 however work did not commence until 1933.

The allocation of land as 'catchment' and the decision to not allow farming to occur on these lands had a big impact on many Karragullen farmers in the 1920s -1940's as their farms were resumed. This decision caused great financial hardship to many of our pioneer orchardists.

The final catchment of Canning Dam - Kangaroo Gully is 59 sq kilometres and the full extent of the dam reservoir is 11km in length.

When it was first built, it provided work for over 500 men and gave a huge boost to local industry. The workers and their families lived in a small township at the western end of the valley downstream from the dam wall.

This settlement had a post office, a general store, a reception hall and a primary school. However there was no hotel. The dam wall was constructed using bulk handling of cement rather than the use of bagged cement. This was the first time this had been used in Australia.

The cement came by rail from the cement works in Rivervale to Armadale and then by road from Armadale to the dam. The dam wall consisted of a series of monolith made up of a single day's concrete pour. The dam was the major source of water for Perth from 1940 - 1961.

The building cost over 1.1million pounds. This represents a huge investment.

In 1999 the dam underwent a major upgrade to refurbish and strengthen the ageing wall (some of the wall had concrete cancer.)

At the dam, visitors can still see the locations of the married men's quarters, the former staff mess and staff quarters to the east and the quarry and the engineer's house to the west.

The Contour Channel

The dam is also historically significant because of its links to the Contour Channel Pipeline System built during the 1930s. This provided employment for over 500 men and indirectly

thousands more during the Great Depression. The contour channel was 15 kilometres long and constructed totally by hand. Most of the workers were sustenance workers who accepted the work readily due to the lack of work elsewhere.

# A possible solution for the parking problem at Araluen

Standard car bays measure  $5.5m \ge 2.5m = 13.75$  sqm and car parks are usually comprised of a land area double the size per bay. So if you want a 100 bay car park you need  $13.75 \ge 2 \ge 100$  square metres.

Hence a 700 bay car park would require a bit under 20,000 square metres of land.

A piece of cleared land a bit over 20,000 square metres which has a 95 metre long common boundary with the Araluen Botanical Park as well as its own drive-way entrance/exit to and from Croyden Road, is now available for purchase at \$579,000.

If that land was bituminised the annual rainwater run-off from it would be around 20 mega litres (20,000 tonnes) so maybe that could be drained alongside the existing drive way down to, then under Croyden and into the Canning River. The distance from the shared 95 m long boundary to the existing Araluen entrance is about a 150 m long walk.

Back in 2001 I was driving new toys. aimlessly around the Perth hills when I picked up the local rag and noticed an ad reading 'fire sale'.

Well curiosity got the better of me so I decided to investigate. That's when I found a studio in the moment allows me to do waiting, disguised as an old water reservoir tank. # **Dry Eyes**

Dry eye syndrome is quite common in the middle aged and elderly. Estimates run as high as 60% in those over 50. Such a condition is exacerbated at this time of year with hay-fever season in full swing, and pollen laden easterly winds blowing.

Those most at risk include those with a history of Gout, arthritis, asthma those taking anti-depressants and woman over 50 taking hormone replacement therapy.

Dry eye syndrome is essentially a disease in which the tear ducts do not produce adequate lubricating tears. This results in instability of the tear film across the eye surface. With dry eye syndrome the layers of the eye fail, leading to soreness and inflammation of the eye surface.

Signs and symptoms include, dryness, slight redness, and "gritty feeling" in the eye, foreign body sensation light intolerance and excessive tearing which seems paradoxical. This is the result of the body attempting to compensate and producing excessive quantities of poorly lubricating tears.

Untreated, dry eye syndrome can lead to, permanent damage to the surface of the eye, shrinking of the lachrymal glands, and an increase in eye infections Dry eye syndrome has been associated with corneal infections which can lead to permanent visual changes.

Causes include:

Age - decline in tear production occurs with increasing age

Sex – females are more prone, possibly due to declining hormone levels post-menopausally

Environment- air conditioning, hot winds, smoke (particularly from cigarettes)

High caffeine intake and a history of heavy alcohol use

Medicines including Nurofen, Voltaren, anti-depressant medications, (Prothiaden, Endep etc) antipsychotic medicines, anxiolytics (Temaze Serepax etc) and the older type antihistamines (Polaramine and Phenergan)

Treatment: Treatment aims to achieve constant lubrication of the eye surface thus alleviating redness, soreness, and discomfort and blurring of vision. The thicker or more viscous the product, the longer relief is given. In severe dry eye conditions these products have to be used frequently (hourly) so it is better to use preservative free single use only products. When lubrication is needed at night, sterile eye ointments such as Duratears and Lacrilube SOP can be used.

Many of the products contain cellulose derivatives such as carmellose (Cellufresh, Celluvisc, refresh tears plus), hypomellose (Genteal, methopt, and poly tears). Viscotears and Genteal Gel containing Carbomer 980 are particularly good for severe dry eyes.

There are so many products on the market it is best to check with your doctor of pharmacist so they can determine which product will best suit your specific symptoms.

Even though dry eye syndrome may seem a minor irritation, our eyes are precious and we need to look after them.

# Are You Bushfire Ready?

This year FESA is predicting that fire season will start early. With heavy winter rains and a dry spring the undergrowth is lush and residents are urged to be fire ready.

The message from the City of Armadale is 'to be prepared'. Residents are encouraged to create a fire management plan for their property, City of Armadale's Chief Bushfire Control officer Brian Watkins encourages residents to: 'decide in advance, in the event of a bushfire, whether you will go or stay and defend the property.'

'If you go, you need to go early. Prior arrangements need to be made for any pets or animals. You will also need a prearranged kit of essential items such as important papers etc and they should be kept where they can be quickly collected.'

If you opt to stay, you should first determine if you are physically able to defend your property. Secondly, determine what resources are there to help you defend your property? Remember, there are often power failures during a fire.'

The City of Armadale also asks residents – especially those living in close proximity to bushland - to clean up their properties now to reduce the risk of a fire starting or spreading. Firebreaks are important.

In recent years there have been an increasing number of programs designed and developed by fire and land management agencies to enhance community safety in the event of a bushfire. These programs are intended to increase awareness, preparedness and self-reliance among communities in high bushfire risk areas. The City of Armadale has adopted the Standard Operational Procedures of the Fire and Emergency Services Authority (FESA). The City of Armadale strongly advises all residents to visit the www.fesa.wa.gov.au website for comprehensive bushfire information and for updates about the condition of a fire in your area. To report a fire emergency, call 000 immediately.

Roleystone residents also need to be aware of their obligations: the City of Armadale publication 'Your rates at work' clearly outlines these. Residents owning land over 5000 sqm must have installed firebreaks.

Red Tail Rural Services (See advert this page, phone Gerry on 9397 5846) is able to assist residents in the construction and maintenance of Firebreaks.

Shingleback Skinks, Syl Cooper or Bobtails as we usually 9397 6184 0417972930. refer to them, can be seen quite frequently during spring either basking in the sun or attempting to cross the road. If you see a Bobtail crossing the road

please stop in a safe place, pick up the Bobtail and move it to the side of the

road. Always move the Bobtail in the direction it was going or it will just turn around and attempt to cross the road again!

The easiest way to pick up a Bobtail is to wave a hand in front of it - the Bobtail will open its mouth making a show of being very threatening and aggressive - whilst it is distracted, bring the other hand in from behind to grasp the Bobtail behind the head and lift it supporting it's lower body with the other hand.

If you find a Bobtail that looks sick and is in poor condition it is a good idea to move it to a fly- proof place and seek advice from, or take it to, a wildlife carer or facility

Bobtails breed in spring with the males following the females around for several weeks and the same breeding pairs form year after year. One to four

## Nursing Shortage Affects Us All

My elderly father has been hospitalised and suffered serious setbacks, due in part to a shortage of nurses and a reliance on agency staff.

WA's public health service is running 800 nurses short, which will worsen as our baby boomers retire. This is a worldwide problem, with some countries so desperate to keep their health professionals that they take away their license if they work overseas!

Not only do we need to train and recruit more nurses, we need to retain them in the industry.

Studies show that pay and job conditions are primary reasons that nurses leave nursing. Long hours and work stress caused by a shortage of staff with too much to do, and too little time to do it leaves nurses frustrated and burned out.

Some nurses leave because they feel underchallenged.

The health professions have historically had

strict job demarcations. There has been some movement from that. For example, Nurse Practitioners are registered for a variety of duties historically reserved for doctors. Midwives independently deliver babies. School dental therapists drill and do fillings. Mental health nurses hospitalise patients pending examination by a psychiatrist.

Dealing with our chronic-and worsening-shortage of nurses requires us to think outside the traditional demarcations.

We must re-think our outdated job descriptions, which are based upon a different time and reality.

New work arrangements in hospitals and health services require new worker types and new approaches to training.

For example, post-graduate training to nurses will enable them to take on less specialised aspects of the traditional doctor's role. This will make nursing a

### Tomato and Zucchini Salad

**Ingredients:** 4 tomatoes, 1 zucchini, chives, parsley and basil-chopped, 4 tbsp olive oil,

1 tbsp white vinegar, <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tbsp mustard, <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tbsp garlic-crushed, pepper.

**Do it:** Cut the tomatoes into wedges, slice the zucchini and chop the chives, parsley and basil. Turn stove on high heat, half fill pan with water and boil, add zucchini and cook for 1 minute, drain off water. Mix zucchini, tomatoes, chives, parsley and basil in salad bowel, refrigerate while making the dressing. Put oil, vinegar, garlic, mustard and pepper in a jar and shake well. Add dressing to salad 15 minutes before serving–*enjoy*.

### Fettuccini

**Ingredients:** 1 pkt fettuccini, 3-4 cloves garlic-chopped, 500ml cream, parmesan cheese-grated, 4-5 rashes bacon-chopped, 10 mushrooms-sliced, salt and pepper, olive oil, 1 egg.

**Do it:** Boil fettuccini, adding salt and a dash of olive oil, boil for approx 15 minutes. Heat oil in deep fry pan, add garlic and bacon, when browned, gradually add cream and parmesan cheese. Boil until sauce thickens, drain pasta and mix in cream sauce, then stir in egg. Mix well and serve–*yum*.

Springtime is a beautiful season which many of us enjoy, going for walks and pursuing more outdoor activities.

Unfortunately it is a very uncomfortable time of the year for many pets which experience constant itching and scratching as they try to relieve their very sensitive skins.

These skin conditions can be frustratingly difficult to correctly diagnose as to their exact cause but most are triggered by an allergy to fleas or some other environmental allergen causing the typically inflamed and reddened skin.

Generally dogs and cats show only minor skin irritation in response to fleabites. In some cases, there will be only small amounts of itching even when there are many fleas on the animal. In contrast, a pet with a flea allergy has a severe, itch-producing reaction to the flea saliva. The pet's response to the intense itching is to chew, lick, or scratch. This causes hair loss and can lead to open sores or scabs on the skin, allowing a secondary bacterial infection to begin. The area most commonly involved is along the spine, just in front of the tail.

### Daylight saving's upon us again

Lately, I've heard it called daylight shifting – an apt description. I regret that we can't put an hour more of sunlight onto the afternoon without pinching it from the morning. I prefer morning. Still, you can't please all of the people all of the time.

At least, the argy-bargy about daylight saving has people talking about the general subject of timekeeping. Until this whole daylight saving issue reared its head, we all just took our clocks for granted.

Way back in the 1890s when Premier John Forrest was trying to get Parliament to fund his dream of building an observatory in Perth, Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) had just been adopted as the basis for establishing longitudinal time zones around the globe.

Ours was to be GMT + 8 hours. This came about as a result of the 1884 International Meridian Conference in Washington, at which it was agreed that the Prime Meridian of Longitude should be the one running from the North Pole, through Greenwich Observatory, and on down to the South Pole.

Choosing a starting point for longitude implicitly established a time base as well, because the Earth's rotation effectively is a progression through the time zones: one cycle every 24 hours.

It would be a tidy arrangement if there were 24 time zones, each one an hour different from those on either side. However, national and state boundaries, topographical features and other complications make a bit of a mishmash of the time zone map.

Not to mention oddities like all of China being covered by just the one time zone, which happens to be the same as WA Standard Time. China doesn't have daylight saving time. Now there's an argument for scrapping daylight saving in WA!

When Perth Observatory opened in 1896, one of its main duties was to compute, maintain and disseminate WA Standard Time.

Daylight saving was introduced nationwide by Commonwealth decree in World War 1 as an economy measure. It happened again in World War 2.

Then Tasmania used daylight saving during a drought in 1967 to reduce water consumption in "hydro" power generation. The other eastern states trialled it in 1971, and it caught on.

The Moon's in waxing crescent phase at the start of the month. First quarter's on the  $6^{th}$ , full moon's on the  $13^{th}$ , and last quarter's on the morning of the  $20^{th}$ . New moon, phase zero, is on the  $28^{th}$ .

After that the waxing crescent phases will lead on into November. On the 13<sup>th</sup>, watch for the full moon rising about 25 minutes after sunset.

Venus holds sway as the brilliant "evening star" dominating the western sky at nightfall. It sets in the WSW around 10:40pm in early November, 11pm in mid-month, and 11:15pm at the end of the month. Jupiter's bright, too, but not nearly as bright as Venus.

You'll find Jupiter high up in the western sky at nightfall in early November. Then it'll slowly get lower and lower, as the weeks go by. Jupiter sets in the WSW around 12:40am at the start of the month.

By mid-month it's going down around midnight, and by month's end it's just after 11pm. Saturn's easily found in the north-eastern sky, not very high up, at daybreak ( about 5am).

As far as the Observatory's concerned, October brings a new season: the public star viewing season.
