

Rememberance Day Grove of the Unforgotten Araluen 2008





90 years on and our community is still recognising the significance of the eleventh hour, of the eleventh day, of the eleventh month. This year's Remembrance Day took on a reverent and breathtakingly beautiful tone in the ceremony held in the Grove of the Unforgotten at Araluen Park.

The Grove was originally set up as a memorial to the 88 Young Australia League members who were killed in the Great War. Cyprus Pines and steps numbering 89, one for each soldier and one for the Unknown Soldier, still stand in enduring testament to their sacrifice. It now stands as a peaceful shrine to those long gone but never to be forgotten.

This year's ceremony was conducted by the Reverend Dr Lesley Borowitzka, The Anglican Priest of Roleystone. The Roleystone Primary School choir, under the expert guidance of Musical Maestro Karen West, sang a range of patriotic songs: ANZAC, Aussie and our own National Anthem. Kelmscott SHS student Cassie Skinner accompanied by Jake Lehman, sang 'And the Band Played Waltzing Matilda'. Cassie's exceptional voice was hauntingly beautiful in this location. Returned Vietnam Veteran Len Copley representing the RSL recited the Ode. A range of individuals were involved in wreath laying again this year - placing the wreaths in the reflection pool.

2008 has seen a resurgence of commemoration of events other than Gallipoli and this day, signifying the end of hostilities in the Great War, has become even more poignant. Congratulations to Rod Ross, Liz Dunn and all of the staff at Araluen for the organisation of this event. A special mention must be made of Grant Nixon and the gardening staff who again had the Park looking spectacular.


DECEMBER

Heather's early life was in the hills at Mundaring. Her mother had seen the famous dancer Pavlova and this inspired her to introduce the young Heather to dancing at the tender age of 5.

This was to be a lifetime passion. With the separation of her parents, Heather went to live with her father in Nedlands and progressed to the Linley Wilson Royal Academy of Dance School where her first teacher was a Roleystone girl – Margaret Powell. (Now married, Margaret White is still a Roley resident).

As a young teen, Heather met Les Baskerville at St Margaret's Anglican Youth Fellowship and it was a case of instant attraction. Les owned a little red MG and took his girlfriend for drives up to the haunts of her youth – Araluen was a favourite, having spent many days there participating in YAL camps.

When Heather married Les Baskerville in 1960 she married into the 'Baskerville Dynasty'. They are able to trace their lineage back to Norman times and have numerous linkages to the Kings of France. The name was later made even more famous by the fictitious 'Hounds of the Baskervilles' penned by Arthur Conan Doyle.

As Les worked for the railways, Les and Heather were then sent to a 'range of country towns' across the wheat belt. They had three children: John, Peter and Leon, but motherhood did not stop her dancing. She could see the need for dancing and the arts in these towns and set herself up as a RAD teacher – and the children went with her to every class.

This progressed to her completing her qualifications to become a schoolteacher, with Heather teaching Grooming and Deportment, Dance, Speech and Drama at Merredin SHS.

Les and Heather had always dreamt of returning to the Hills (the site of their courtship) and purchased a block of land on Hall Rd from the deceased estate of the distinguished WA Poet Griffith Watkins -formerly owned by the Powell family. They started to build in 1973 and moved into their dream home 'Baskerville Hall' in 1974. As soon as she came to town she joined the Roleystone Theatre and appeared in countless productions over the next twenty years.

By 1984 Heather changed careers and moved into promoting, facilitating (and being the chaperone for) the Miss Australian Quest, which raised muchneeded funds for children with Cerebral Palsy. She is sorry that public opinion 'anti beauty pageants' in the early 1990's closed this down as the money raised made a significant difference to research about this horrible affliction.

Heather then moved to the role she currently holds: Regional Organiser for WA for the Royal Academy of Dance. This organisation is one of the largest training organisations in the world and there are 45 schools in WA. In 2008, 1300 student sat exams from schools from Karratha to Manjimup. Heather organised the exams and the examiners who come from interstate and overseas.

Heather's other passion besides her job is travel and she often gets to marry the two together. Last year she travelled to Japan on the Australian Ballet tour.

Heather is very proud that her own love of dance is seeing a new lease with her granddaughter Kaitlin studying dancing at the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts.

All the best into the future Heather and thanks for your contribution to Dance and to your community.

Some of the Mystery of Alice Reserve Unravelled


In an article in last month's Roleystone Courier entitled 'Who was Alice' it was announced that the City of Armadale was searching for the origin of the naming of Alice Reserve. I can partly explain this mystery.


In the early 1980s, when the reserve was first proposed by local councillors and the original trees planted by the then Roleystone Primary School, it was proposed that it be named 'Slab Gully Reserve'. We lived near this reserve and I felt that it would be better to name it after the road adjoining the reserve – Alice Road.

The roads in this area are all named after first names Alice, Norman and Trevor. In order to research where these names came from, I contacted the developer however we had no response. I also reviewed the DOLA records to see whether these names were those of any of the former owners of this land (or their children). There were no records that related to these names. Thus we decided that they were not linked to anyone of 'local historical significance' and probably just developed on the whim of the developer or relevant council employee.

This doesn't totally explain 'Who Alice Was' but I feel it does show why the reserve is so named.

The men have struggled a little and unfortunately had to give up last Saturday in the rain when they were ahead. Better luck for the rest of the season.


Wednesdays have not been very well attended lately. I do hope a few more players will start to show some extra interest as the weather improves.

The growth of Pterygium or Farmer's Dusty Eye Cataracts

The pink triangle or wing growing from the corner along the eye's white sclera toward the pupil is not an (internal) cataract but is an external cell growth developing due to ultraviolet light or dust. Australia's high U.V. starts the cellular change even in childhood. You

are far more likely to develop this ailment if you have a family history.

Working in a dusty environment markedly increases the chances of developing a pterygium. For those who are susceptible, the first signs can be seen by their teenage years. A noticeable yellow (oily) lump develops on the white sclera, this becomes red and engorged a few years later. When it starts to take a bite out of the cornea/colour it is simple to surgically remove it. This is preferable to allowing it to distort the eye, which happens if left untreated.

However unless a conjunctival graft with dissolvable sutures (Biosorb) is used to replace the lump, the pterygium can grow again. The removal then would need an expert ophthalmic surgeon.

For people living north of the 32% parallel (anyone living from Mandurah to Kununurra) wearing a hat from an early age can prevent 47% of pterygium. Wearing U.V. sunglasses prevents more than 88% of pteryguims growing. Although eye drops also help prevent them, very few sufferers bother until the pterygium become red, itchy or dry. By then the growth often needs steroid drops. This needs to be prescribed by an Ophthalmologist, as steroids cause Glaucoma or Cataract.



Slap on the Sunscreen - But Which One to Use?

With another hot summer coming up, I thought it important to remind everyone of the importance to protect from the harmful effects of the suns rays. Skin cancer is still a major problem in WA.

Two thirds of those born in or who spent their childhood in Australia will have a combinations of these chemical skin cancer sometime in their life. 374,000 Australians are diagnosed with skin cancer each year. Between 1200-1300 people die as a result of skin cancers.

Choosing a sunscreen for the whole to remember: family is not always easy, especially if some family members have allergies or eczema. Other factors which may impact on sunscreen choice are age of user, length of coverage required and physical activity levels. Remember also it is not only water/waves that wash off sunscreen but perspiration also.

Classification of Sunscreens

Sunscreens are classified either as broad or narrow spectrum or according to it's Sun Protection Factor (SPF). A broad spectrum sun screen protects from both UVA and UVB radiation.

The SPF factor however measures how good a sunscreen is at providing protection from UVB rays. SPF 30+ simply means the sunscreen will give you 31 times your normal protection. In reality an SPF 15 blocks about 94% UV, and SPF 30 about 97% UV.

Sunscreen Ingredients Sunscreens contain both chemical and physical agents to block UV radiation. Essentially only two physical agents are used, Zinc Oxide and Titanium Dioxide.

These agents reflect both UVA and UVB rays away and essentially form a physical barrier against the radiation. These agents are not broken down or chemically altered by ASK YOUR PHARMACIST the radiation therefore can be used long term. An example of this is cricketers plastering

There are many different chemical absorbers, some which absorb only UVA or B and some that do both. It is important to remember that these agents are broken down as a result of the UVA and B rays hence the need to reapply sunscreens every 2-3 hours.

Sunscreens will often include absorbers to maximize protection and minimize skin reactions to them.

Application of Sunscreens

The following points are important

- Apply 15 minutes prior to exposure (sunscreen will bond to skin).
- Wear under moisturizer, make up or insect repellant.
- Reapply every two hours or more frequently, if removed by water, perspiration or towel
- Apply generously e.g. 1 teaspoonful for each arm, leg front and back of body and half a teaspoonful for the neck and face for an average adult.
- Apply to clean dry skin.

There are many sunscreen products on the market. Low irritant sunscreens commonly do not contain chemical absorbers and are therefore more useful for young children or those with sensitive skin.

'Sports' milks or creams often have more oily bases and therefore stay on longer in the water. 'Ultra' sunscreens often have the greatest SPF factor although advertising restrictions do not permit more than an SPF 30+ rating.

With her husband Patrick, they have cleverly surrounded the house with vegetation, thus cooling the area and reducing the need for artificial cooling. The gardens are watered by recycled water from the bio-system. It is unnecessary to fertilise either, as the water is full of beneficial nutrients, and with a \$10 water bill each time, this is indeed cheap environmentally friendly living.





gentle stream became an icy deluge, completely taking my breath away. Before I could respond, it changed again into a boiling flow, which would have cooked a chicken faster than our microwave! I finally leapt out; gasping for breath with skin mottled blue and pink and sat down quickly before I passed out. (I have been known to exaggerate the effects of discomfort!)

Unbeknownst to me, my wife Hilary had been having her own daydreams whilst pottering in the kitchen. She had turned on the hot tap to wash a jug and then rinsed it in cold water. The interconnections in our plumbing system ensured that the temperature of the water supply to the shower followed an inverse relationship to the temperature of the supply to the kitchen - hence the freezer/ cooker effect.

It's not hard to draw a spiritual lesson or two out of this domestic crisis. Someone once said 'No man (or woman) is an island." Whenever we say or do something, it has an effect elsewhere and sometimes we are totally ignorant of the influence we have on others. This can be either positive or negative. There was a question and answer session afterwards with some children receiving a drink bottle as a prize. There's always a lot of participation when there's the possibility of receiving something in return.



Astronomical Highlights for November

Having started the month side by side in the western evening sky, Venus and Jupiter will then steadily drift apart.

In a case like this, with one object much brighter than the other, we tend to think that the brighter object is staying put and the other one's moving.

From time to time the Observatory gets a call along these lines: "Last night that bright star was next to the Moon, but now it's moved!"

No, the Moon has moved. The Moon's close to us, actually orbiting around us, and moves its own width every hour, as compared with the stars. That's 24 times its own width, every day! Generally a brighter object is nearer and therefore its motion is more apparent. Use the backdrop of the distant stars as a frame of reference.

You'll find that Venus, being nearer to us, is moving very noticeably against the stellar background compared with Jupiter, which moves very little.

Why, then, is Jupiter setting earlier and earlier while Venus holds position? Because Jupiter's going with the stars and the stars are slowly scrolling west. If you watch the stars day by day, at the same time (say 9:30pm), you'll find that those in the west set a bit earlier each day. Those in the east rise a bit earlier each day. About 4 minutes earlier. This slow scrolling is due to the Earth's movement around the Sun.

In the first days of December, Venus and Jupiter are setting together in the WSW around 11pm. Soon, however, it becomes plain that Jupiter is setting earlier: around 10:15pm in mid-month and 9:20pm (end of evening twilight) by New Year's Eve. Venus will continue to dominate the western evening sky until late February.

The only other planet of note is Saturn, which rises just to the north of east at about 2:30am in early December, 1:30am midmonth, and 12:30am at month's end. The Moon begins the month in waxing crescent phase, leading to first quarter on the 6th and full moon on the night of the 12th, when the full moon will be rising as the Sun sets.

After the 12th – 13th the Moon goes on the wane, with last quarter on the 19th and new moon on the 27th. Then the wax-

ing crescent phases will take us into the New Year, with the Moon near Venus on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day.

The summer solstice will occur on the 21st: the time of longest day and shortest night. It's the time when the Sun's as far south as it can go, from our earth-centred point of view. For more detail on the solar system phenomena described here (and much more!), you should consider investing in a copy of the Perth Observatory's Astronomy Almanac 2009, available now. Also, if you want to go to an evening of stargazing at the Observatory, you'd better book now for the school holidays. Phone 9293-8255, 9am – 4pm weekdays.

We eventually found the dead mother and soon after located the poor little Joey. It was too small to survive alone so my colleague stayed to watch the joey (about 2 meters into the bush), whist I returned to my car, parked about 400 metres away, for the capture equipment.

I was close to my car when a vehicle, travelling, very quickly, down Heritage Dr, hit a kangaroo crossing the road. The animal flew though the air, narrowly missing my colleague, and disappeared into the bush.

The sounds of movement, pain and stress could be heard from the injured animal for a short time. Unfortunately even after a relentless search we were unable to locate either injured animal or the poor little Joey.
