### Kelmscott Migrant Camp Celebration



Just south of the Brookton Valley shops, the Kelmscott Migrant Park once accommodated hundreds of new immigrants in Nissan huts, many escaping war ravaged Europe at the end of the Second World War and into the population explosion happening in Australia in the 1950's. This site has now been officially recognised as a historic site.

On Saturday November 18, 2010 the City of Armadale Mayor Linton Reynolds officially opened the Kelmscott Migrant Camp Park. This site now features display boards and a commemorative plaque recording the historical significance of the area. A

wide range of people attended the opening including the committee, invited guests and former residents of the Park. All members of the original Migrant Camp Park Committee were present for the official commemoration: Adrian and Lesley Choules, Margaret Bettenay, Rosalind Buckingham, Kathleen Coulthard, Kim Fletcher, Bob Noakes and Cr Henry Zelones. ## Community Your Opportunity Alive Group to Have Your Say

Many across our community are very aware of the high rates of early death caused by risky behaviours and suicide occurring across the Roleystone Karragullen Community.

A group of concerned people has been meeting regularly to address this issue. The group has recently become known as The Roleystone Community Alive Group. Under the direction of this committee and utilising the recently launched Suicide Prevention Strategy, Centrecare is developing an action plan for our community.

Over the previous decade nearly everyone across our community has been touched by the tragic loss of those who are taken prematurely. This has been felt even more keenly in our region because of the close nature of our community. I have often thought that one of the great strengths of this location is that we know each other and we care – so this is our chance to show that this is true. ECU Director Dr Pamela Henry

has been developing a survey

that will gauge the attitudes and feeling of local youth and concerned adults. This will include interviewing a range of young people and talking to those touched by suicide to gather information about the risk factors within our community. These interviews will be anonymous and carried out on an individual basis.

# WATER FLOW REDUCTION IN THE CANNING RIVER

The Department of Water sent a letter to our household this week.

As a resident of Roleystone, with a block that backs onto the Canning River with pumping rights, I assumed that this letter was the official notification that pumping water from the Canning River should cease over the summer months. But no, I was shocked to see that this letter requested that we only reduce the water pumped from the river this summer! What is particularly concerning is that the Department will be reducing the volume of water released into the Canning River this summer by 50%. This will undoubtedly further jeopardise the multitudes of wildlife that the River supports. I thought it important that the residents of Roleystone should at least be aware that most properties that back onto the Canning River have access (providing that they have pumping rights) to the water in the river. This is mostly used to water gardens.

In addition to this, due to damming of natural springs which would normally flow into the Canning (most notably at Araluen Resort) the very flow of the river is entirely dependent on released mains water. If the Water Department chooses to turn this tap off then the River is dead. I find this outragious.

Surely the preservation of the River, for the pleasure of all, takes precedence over maintaining gardens, for the pleasure of a few?

Roley Pool and the lovely walk trail that follows the path of the River is a source of pleasure for many residents of Roleystone. It is part of our heritage and it needs to be protected.

If you are as concerned as I am about preserving what is left of the Canning River, please join me in contacting the Department of Water to voice your concern and request that pumping of water from the River for domestic purposes ceases and that the flow of the river is not reduced by a further 50%. *D Mutton* 

# COUNCILLOR PAT HART'S RESPONSE TO THE NOVEMBER EDITORIAL

As the spring on Irymple Road is in a non proclaimed water area it is very difficult to get real support for this issue as I have tried in the past. There is no legislation that I am aware of that will cover this situation in this or similar areas.

We also have another site in Coventry Road that has approval for extraction; those living around the site believe this has impacted severely on their water supplies as they also have no scheme water.

I will ensure again that Council is made well aware of the situation and I will re-affirm community concerns that they should not consider approving similar applications for water extraction. Also given the current dire predicament we are all in for water, that there should be no increased allowances for anyone that already has approval.

The underground streams that all bores in the hills feed from certainly, from all accounts, have very low or zero flows this year. Many of those still working will obviously go dry if we have no rain to replenish them.

Everyone needs to be aware of how they are using water and the implications it has for other users and for natures survival. Keep in mind those people with bores located below your property as you may be connected through an underground stream. Be very mindful of how much you are extracting.

The flows into the dams have long ceased and this year has seen the lowest in-flows ever recorded.

I believe Canning Dam is nearing only 30% capacity. With at least 5 months before we can expect any decent rain, we are all facing big challenges. Our only hope is that we have a cyclone come through which gives us a deluge. Who knows – this extended dry period could last for a few more years. We need to accept this and get the best out of a bad situation and take a positive approach to the challenges it brings.

This is a major issue for the whole community. As you would be aware the Canning River is 100% dammed and only flows in summer through environmental releases. This year they are releasing 50% less water than last year into the Canning River as we strive to keep fresh water in the deep pools to sustain fish and other aquatic life over this extended dry period. All licensed extractors along the river have been asked to reduce their uptake by 50%. They are all on scheme water now and have this alternative water supply. All riparian extractors will be asked to cease or only extract twice a week as per current regulations as it is scheme water going into the river.

### Coca Cola Amatil response to Editorial on Use of Roleystone's Water Reserves.

I wish to clarify some facts in response to your editorial on water use in Roleystone in the November issue of the Roleystone Courier.

Firstly, the efficient and sustainable use of water is a major focus for Neverfail and its parent company Coca-Cola Amatil (CCA). Every water source undergoes stringent hydrogeological assessment processes and CCA has invested \$8million into infrastructure, expert hydrogeologists and technology to ensure all our water sources are sustainability managed.

Contrary to your claims our Roleystone source is subject to a maximum draw limit per annum, as per Planning permission

in 1997. This has been reviewed and reconfirmed since. Additionally we have not increased tanker loads - in fact, we have drawn almost 15% less from Roleystone over the last year.

To put things into context, groundwater used to supply the total bottled water industry in Australia is estimated to be just under 0.01% of the groundwater allocated for use in Australia each year (source ABWI).

We appreciate your assistance in clarifying these facts.

### A Response from a Downstream Neighbour 'Who Owns Roleystone's Water Reserves?'

### Thank you for the opportunity to reply to the letter from Coca-Cola Amatil.

Our property is directly below the water extraction facility in question on Irymple Road. It was purchased by my family in 1955 and has been a commercial orchard for over 50 years. There are other orchards on our road and collectively they generate a strong economic turnover for the district and employment for local residents.

Ten years ago we would be able to irrigate our orchard and our dam would replenish overnight from the underground water supply. We now rely totally on ground water and bores to fill our dams. Already, our bores are struggling to supply water for irrigation.

I acknowledge that our dry winter and the cumulative impact of groundwater abstraction has contributed to this decline. However, many believe, the water table has been dramatically affected by the extraction of water by Coca-Cola Amatil on the property on Irymple Road.

Each week, a total of 14 tankers with a 29,400 litre capacity have approval to remove water. It is stated that since 1997 the water draw has been reviewed and re-confirmed.

This is correct though not for the lack of trying. In 2005 an application to increase water draw to 18 tanker loads per week was submitted to the City of Armadale. This application was withdrawn after strong opposition by neighbouring residents and subsequent refusal by the Department of Environment.

Coca-Cola Amatil would like to put things in perspective and quote the statistics of 0.01% of groundwater is allocated to the bottled water industry. Unfortunately I think it's 0.01% too much when surrounding properties are affected, in particular businesses which rely on that resource.

Scheme water is unavailable here. If necessary I'll source water from other avenues for our domestic use (many others do the same), however, it is impossible to do so for our commercial need.

I have recently been in communication with Emma Peacock from Coca-Cola Amatil. A hydrogeological assessment of the water extraction facility, conducted by SKM Consultancy, will be completed shortly.

Not once in 18 years of operation have any neighbouring residents been consulted or surveyed regarding their water supplies which I believe is critical to establish a sound hydrogeological report.

Roleystone and Karragullen are renowned for their orchards. They grow the delicious varieties of fruit that we all enjoy. The water that we use seeps back into the ground, recycled you could say. Neverfail simply remove millions of litres of water each year.

Water sustainability, justifiably, is a major focus for residents and requires sensible management for the long term. Water availability, however, is the immediate concern.

### A Very Cherry Christmas to All

I was asked to write this for the Sunday Times and I thought Roley Courier readers might like to read it too! (See Fresh food guide on Dec

Christmas' and can be used in so many ways to add that special touch to desserts and to many a main course. However like all fruit, quality is very make a mistake if they are seduced by cheap cherries or cherries that may look



good but the taste just isn't there.

So here are some hints on selecting cherries for your Christmas table.

### How to select the best cherries.

Fresh is always best. If the cherries are grown here in Western Australia they are likely to be far fresher than imports from the East. ### FAREWELL GENTLEMAN WALTER 'JIM' BULLEN

Long-term Roleystone resident Walter (Jim) Bullen passed away in mid November in his 89th year.


A real English gentleman, many across town will recall him going to the shops in his suit and tie.

Jim leaves his loving wife Norma, his 4 children: Andrew, Reg, Stephen and Mary, 17 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren.

Jim was born and grew up in Bristol in England. He was raised by his mother as his father died in 1928 after the Western Front in WW1.

Jim joined the British Army of WW2 and initially was stationed in Bristol. While stationed there he met his future wife Norma who was a telephonist and Jim and Norma 'became a couple', marrying in 1945 on his only home leave.

Soon after this Jim was sent with his unit to Burma to assist in preventing the southern movement of the Japanese. When Burma was overthrown Jim was not captured and their unit was pushed to the hilly wild jungle area of northern Burma where he spent the next three years. Following the war, Jim returned to the UK and once again began to work as an accountant. Through the fifties Norma and Jim had four children and life was very pleasant. Jim had a good job and they were very comfortable but decided to immigrate in 1958.

They arrived in Perth in the 60's and after initially renting (at only 16) at the outbreak in North Perth for 4 pounds a week they purchased a home in Peet Road Roleystone (the old 'Beales House'). They soon forged many firm friendships. The Bullens soon joined the Congregational Church and Jim has been a stalwart of the church community over the last fifty years.

> Once the children were at school the couple began fostering children and thus many children were able to benefit from Jim and his warm loving family. (12 people lived in this original 2 bedroom house from 68 - 72.) Following the 'fostering phase' of their lives and with their own children all grown up, Jim and Norma then decided to assist in Papua New Guinea at Tari near Mt Hagen. His role was diverse: running the agency, banking, weather forecaster, serving the petrol, running the general store and some support missionary work. Jim loved the time he spent in New Guinea. In Reg's words: 'He went to PNG as a church person and came back as

### SPEED UP AND SIT STILL

Martin Whitely's Book Speed Up and Sit Still - exposes the truth about ADHD child drugging.



The real losers in the ADHD debate are children who are completely powerless to prevent themselves being

Mr Whitely is scathing in his assessment of his fellow politicians claiming most leave the controversial issue in the "too hard basket" or do as the Rudd and Howard Governments did, "delegate the solution to the problem of reckless prescribing to those who had created it in the first place.





### - ADVICE FOR RESIDENTS

Bushfires occur every summer and often start without warning. This is why developing and using a Bushfire Survival Plan is critical.

City of Armadale Chief Bush Fire Control Officer, Brian Watkins, said this plan would help local residents take action and avoid making lastminute decisions that could prove deadly during a bushfire.

"When developing your plan, decide if you will leave for a safer place or stay to actively defend your home," Mr Watkins said. The plan needs to take into account different circumstances and be based on the Fire Danger Rating.

You must decide when it would be best to leave. Homes are not designed or constructed to withstand fires started in catastrophic fire weather conditions. On these days you should put your survival first and leave early,. Conditions can change very quickly in a bushfire and often without warning, so a back-up plan is vital. Remember that this year's bushfire season is here early. This means you need to bring your planning forward as well."

> Heading in to the last few games before 📵 the Christmas break, the club has witnessed a great start to the season with all five teams in top 4 positions!







### Hay Fever

The Hay fever season is in full swing once again as the pollen or allergen levels rise in the air.

Symptoms: Hay fever is the acute seasonal form of allergic rhinitis. Symptoms can be severe and often very debilitating and include sneezing, runny nose, nasal congestion, intense itching of the mouth, nose and ears and conjunctivitis. The nasal mucous membranes become congested and swollen producing a clear watery nasal discharge. Due to poor airflow frontal headaches often occur. A dry irritating cough can subsequently occur as well as exacerbation of asthma. Mamy of these symptoms are similar to the common head cold so it is important to check with your pharmacist to differentiate between the two.

One of the common complications of hay fever is Hay Fever Conjunctivitis. The surface of the eye becomes itchy, a watery discharge occurs and the eye surface takes on a red appearance as blood vessels become swollen.

Both hay fever and seasonal allergic conjunctivitis are the result of hypersensitivity reactions to specific antigens. These are usually airborne pollens from trees, grasses and weeds. Symptoms vary often from day to day throughout the hay fever season depending on the pollen levels in the air.

The body responds to these allergens by releasing histamine which causes the symptoms of swelling and itching of the mucous membranes. Because we can't predict the allergen levels from day to day it is often best to block this histamine release constantly by taking antihistamines regularly.

Treatment: Antihistamines form the main stay of treatment and are divided depending on how likely they are to cause drowsiness.

Generally the longer acting non-sedating antihistamines are used such as Telfast, Zyrtec, Aerius and Claratyne. Side effects with such medications are generally minimal but for those highly sensitive individuals sometimes the symptoms are not fully eased.

Eye Drops: Many eye drops are available to reduce the itching and redness associated with hay-fever such as: Antistine Privine, Naphcon A and Albalon A however burning, stinging and irritation can accompany instillation of these drops. These can only be used short term. Newer antihistamine eye drops such as Livostin and Eyezep not only reduce itchy symptoms but stabilise the eye surface from reacting to allergens. Zaditen also works effectively with a three way action, as an antihistamine, anti-inflammatory and stabiliser.

Nasal Sprays. Used when antihistamines fail to treat all symptoms. Azep rapidly reduce the runny nose and itchy in the nasal passages. Cortisone nasal sprays (Telnase, Beconase, Rhinocort and Nasonex) are safe and effective over time and effectively reduce nasal swelling and runny nose symptoms.

Alternate, herbal and homeopathic remedies are also available.

So with the hay fever season in full swing, don't suffer in silence. Help and friendly advice is always available. Just ask your pharmacist.









### Dick Wittington -An Update

Following the story of the restoration of Dick Wittington in last month's edition....,

The original statue of Dick Whittington was built by Den Howarth in the late 1970's. Den was a painter and decorator by trade and art was his hobby. He was an Englishman who built the statue to show the distance back to London. He named the block Passing Clouds after an English Cigarette Company (he was a very heavy smoker). Sadly he died of emphysema some years later. Den had to build the statue twice as the first was destroyed by vandals. So this was built to last and anchored firmly into the ground.

### Gardening Notes Jean: 9397 5547

December already and I now know why there is a ember on the end of the word. We have had a real taste of what is to come.

Each year I like the heat less, but when I look back I realise how well we humans and our gardens cope with each season. As we look around the garden we see so many lovely summer plants in bloom. Bougainvillea is so floriferous when it is not molly coddled and it has very few prickles in amongst the colourful bracts. Unlike roses it doesn't appear affected by the heat. The perfume from the roses though makes all the hard work in keeping them in bloom worthwhile. I find the scent of Cestrum nocturnis (night scented Jessamine) very pleasant, not too strong and it gently lets us know that there is a bush somewhere close. The insignificant flower certainly wouldn't encourage you to grow it.

A very beautiful scented plant is the mock orange (philadelphus coronarius (virginal)). This has a largish soft white many-petalled blossom. It is reasonably easy to grow from cuttings. I found that Daphne grows easily from cuttings too.

There are a couple of new gardenias available, white pearl and the four season's gardenia.

These do very well in full sun and you get a lot more flowers. Here in Roleystone, with our acidic soil we do not get such yellowing of the leaves over winter. This is generally the result of too little iron and magnesium.

If you want to please family or friends at Christmas you can give them a lovely hydrangea. This provides a cool and refreshing plant that will act as a barometer to the garden - letting you know when to water.

Take care with any fruit trees you may have and be sure to pick up any fallen fruit. By putting it into a sealed plastic bag it will cause any maggots to cook in the sunlight, preventing the cycle recurring next year.



Many times I will see clients of mine out and about enjoying themselves in a cafe, eating muffins and drinking mochas.

Don't get me wrong, I don't want anyone to feel guilty for enjoying themselves, you should enjoy yourself. But I almost ALWAYS get a guilty look as they say something along the lines of "I walked the dog this morning, so it's ok, I burnt the energy". I had an extreme case about six years ago where my client would go to the cafe and have a large slice of chocolate cake and a coffee before every session!

Seeing as exercise is commonly used as a way out of eating responsibly, I thought I would clear up the question "Can you out-exercise your diet?"

The short answer is NO! Muahahaha!! (queue the thunder clap and screeching strings)!

"Naughty" food, in general, is so high in energy (calorie) content that it would only be possible to "out-exercise" it if "exercise" were your full time

EXCERCISE VERSUS DIET

As most of us have rather sedentary jobs, we need to be mindful of what we eat and consume the "naughty" stuff in moderation.

Just to give you a little snapshot of how much exercise it takes to "burn off" or "earn" the food you consume, here are a few foods and the time it takes to exercise them off.

A 55g chocolate bar takes about three and a half hours of walking or playing golf to burn! (and yes, golf does burn pretty much the same amount as walking). If you want to speed that up, you could try swimming for two and a half hours!

A 100g packet of chips takes approximately six hours of walking while a small serve of salted nut mix will take about three and a half.

So why bother exercising at all? Why not just eat in moderation and forget about getting sweaty all

Because it has been proven time and time again that "dieting" on its own has no long term benefits to weight loss for most people. In fact it almost always ends up having the reverse effect.

As always, the only sure path to success is eating in moderation (and yes, that does include the allowance of occasional "naughtiness") and exercising safely, just slightly beyond your comfort zone 2 - 3 times per week.



# Stop and Search Powers Helen Morton MLC

Member for East Metropolitan Region



The proposed "Stop and Search" Bill has been a hot topic in the media lately. While it appears that the laws will not proceed at this point in time, you may wish to know the background of the current powers held by police and the changes proposed by the Bill.

The police are currently provided with powers to stop and search people pursuant to the Criminal Investigation Act 2006. The Act provides two separate sets of circumstances in which the police may stop and search people, without the need to obtain a search warrant. Firstly, a police officer may search a person if they reasonably suspect that person is in possession of an item connected to the commission of an offence. Secondly, the police may conduct a search of a person or vehicle within an area which has been prescribed or declared under the Act. Unlike the first mentioned power, the police may conduct a search for any reason and do not require "reasonable suspicion". However, a person must first consent to the search taking place.

The Stop and Search Bill was introduced in response to community outcry regarding increased incidents of violence and the proliferation of weapons. It sought to provide the police with greater powers, so that they would be permitted to stop and search people without their consent. This power, however, was to be limited in that a search could only be executed in specified areas. Further, police officers would only have been permitted

to conduct a basic search, similar in nature to that undertaken by airport security. For example the search could have involved: the use of metal detectors; the removal or a person's outer clothing; and a pat-down.

Providing greater powers to the police is always going to be a controversial issue. It is important for any government to ensure that a balance is achieved between any reduction in civil liberties and the protection of citizens.

# Wild Gossip

How delightful it is hone; to see and hear all the young birds out and about, begging for food and practicing flying skills with proud parents hone;

busily attending!

The young birds seem so demanding and noisy yet the parents continue their care. Sometimes the adult birds do leave their young for a while to look for other food sources and experiences to share with them but will return shortly. Please leave young birds alone to continue their learning and enjoy their young lives in their parents care.

Occasionally you may find a young bird on the ground in a dangerous situation eg. dog or cat around – if the predator cannot be removed or contained then the only option is to gently pick up the young bird and place it safely on a nearby tree branch or similar.

If you find a young bird that you think is injured or seems to have been abandoned please contact a Wildlife Carer or Shelter for advice and if instructed to remove the bird please be sure that you know the exact location for future return.

There is one circumstance when intervention is usually required, this is when young bird has been late returning to the nest and been caught outside its time zone:

A day bird (diurnal) eg magpie,

honeyeater, parrot etc. caught out at night. A night bird (nocturnal) eg owl, tawny frogmouth etc caught out during the day.

Both situations require intervention as the young bird is likely to be attacked by birds in their correct time zone and also the young bird is inexperienced with the different predators around at the time.

Nocturnal birds also have the additional danger that the branch or rock they are resting on which looked quite good at night might not be the best location when the sun comes out, especially on a hot day! The best solution is to gently pick up the bird, using a towel for protection from beak and

claws, place it in a box, keep in a quiet dark place and return to original place at the appropriate time dawn or dusk – if unsure in anyway please contact your local Wildlife Carer or Shelter. We can all help our wildlife throughout the summer by providing fresh water in shallow containers both on the ground and above, bird baths would also be appreciated and well used – I have 3 bird baths and there is often a queue!

Finally a reminder that whilst everyone is busy and services are limited during the festive season our wildlife will still need help and care.

Please contact me for help for or advice about all orphaned or injured wildlife.



If we don't, then don't buy stuff from the commercial yobs who seem intent on degrading all that is admirable in our culture. If their adverts don't do the biz, then they'll stop them. I think they have at least that much sense!

And if anybody thinks fuming like Mount Etna is un-Christian, consider the anger Jesus displayed at the equally despicable commercial traders in the temple of his day. The baby in the manger grew to be a man who was capable of expressing himself better than anybody else before or since and he aimed some of his sharpest verbal darts at those who profiteered from sacred activities. The month with the longest days is upon us again: Christmas is nigh. Why do the years keep whizzing by like this?

About 25 years ago I thought it was funny when someone said that once you get over the hill, you start to pick up speed. Now it doesn't seem very funny. Speaking of speed, contemplate for a moment the fact that if we, or all life for that matter, just disappeared from the face of the Earth, the planet would continue belting around the Sun at about 30 km per second.

And that's what a year is: one belt around the Sun. We're poised to start another

I'm sure that Christmas is a leftover from long-ago northern hemisphere solstice ceremonies. Not the dancing naked variety: we're dealing with the northern winter. The solstice will occur on the

In Perth, official sunrise on the 22nd will be at 5:08am and official sunset will be at 7:22pm. So day length at the solstice will be 14 hours and 14 minutes. Longer, if vou're further south. In Hobart, it would be 15 hours 22 minutes.

The Moon's waning crescent phases start the month: morning crescents, leading to new (no) moon on the 6th. On the 7th, the thin new crescent moon will be setting about an hour and a half after sunset.

The waxing crescent phases will lead to first quarter on the 13th. From that point, it's the waxing gibbous moon, the half-moon with a hump, until full moon on the 21st. Then the waning gibbous phases. Last quarter on the 28th. Then waning crescents again, leading to new moon on January 4th next year.

Jupiter will continue as dominant evening planet throughout December. Early in the month it's very high in the NNW at dusk, and setting in the west around 1:15am.

In mid-month, it's high up in the north-west at nightfall and sets just after midnight. By the end of the month Jupiter's prominent well up in the WNW in the early evening, setting around 11:20pm. It's a good target for Christmas telescopes: the four big Galilean moons can be seen to change position day by

Venus is starting a stint of several months as "morning star". If you're up and about at daybreak, i.e. around 4am, you can't mistake Venus: it's brilliant and dominates the eastern sky at morning twilight. Saturn's a morning object, too, rising in the east around 2:40am at the start of the month, 1:40am mid-month, and 12:50am by month's end.

It's a fine target for Christmas telescopes, located high in the NE sky at first light.
