# EEDEDCR CAROLINE WIELINGA'S RESPONSEproachedTO THE NOVEMBER EDITORIAL

I write in response to the editorial dated November 2010. I wish to correct the fallacy regarding water limits obtained from the spring at Irymple Road. There is clearly a maximum. In 1992 CoA granted a maximum of 75,000L/week. In 1996 Council requested a hydrogeological report prior to granting any increase and were subsequently appealed against to the Minister for Planning. Hence in 1997 the contract increased to 420,000L/week by the Minister for Planning without a hydrogeological report.

2003 I n CoA approved extraction of 412,000L/week. I have made enquiries about this volume of water and was told by a Water Policy Officer that 21megalitres/year is not a large volume of water relative to the amounts used elsewhere. I have also been told that the study of underground water movements in the hills region is woefully incomplete due to the complexity of the geological features and therefore that a hydrogeological report would be difficult, if not impossible at this stage, to produce.

Hence although this spring contributes to the stream

and the water is being lost, it is impossible to tell what is the extent of the impact on the local underground water supplies. The two main concerns of this extraction are the reduced water yields of downstream/neighbouring orchards and the general loss to the local stream ecology from reduced flows. The current approval to Neverfail does not have a review period, hence I have been advised by the City that the amount drawn from the spring cannot be revised by the City at this stage.

I am of the understanding therefore that, to revise the amount of water drawn from this spring, appeals would have to be made to the State. The grounds for appeal would relate to the apparent harm to the local fruit industry and stream ecosystem.

The difficulty of such an appeal is to prove how much the extraction is affecting local residents and hence the residents have been advised to coordinate and approach the Department of Water for monitoring assistance. With conflict between our food and drink resources, it should be evident that we all need to be more responsible about our water use. Caroline Wielinga

## Local Residents Concerned with the Drought in the Upper reaches of the Canning River

#### The topic of water use and water releases into the Canning River is of considerable interest and no doubt of some concern to local residents in times when water is such a scarce resource.

Recent shortages and increasing costs appear to be refocussing many of us on the need to use water wisely and frugally. As a Roleystone resident for the last sixty years I have had the opportunity to observe water levels in the Canning River and the situation has certainly deteriorated markedly in the last five years.

Since 2008 I have raised my concerns with the Department of Water regarding the very low levels and non-existent flow rates of water in the section of river between the Canning Dam wall and Araluen during the summer months.

This section of the river is an important eco system supporting numerous species of native fish, long necked turtles and crustaceans. Many freshwater fish species which are endemic to the south-west of Western Australia are found in the Canning River system. However studies at Curtin University of fish and fish habitats in the area have shown that fish numbers are low due to a loss of habitat and a loss of linkage between breeding areas due to low flows, preventing fish migrating upstream and reaching important breeding and nursery grounds. Stagnating water caused by a lack of water flow has provided a suitable breeding area of an introduced pest, the Mosquito fish.

In recent summers this stretch of river has been reduced to a few pools, many at very low levels and undoubtedly struggling to maintain their aquatic environment. It seems to be completely overlooked and is seriously under threat.

Damming of the Canning caused dramatic flow reductions that significantly altered downstream aquatic macro invertebrate communities. The lack of water flow has also resulted in a poor flushing effect below the dam wall.

Many river pools which are an important summer refuge and habitat for aquatic and terrestrial flora and fauna have been lost due to modification of the flow regime.

Periodic flooding of the Canning River from the dam is required to recharge shallow groundwater tables that are

important during periods of drought and to discourage and prevent weed growth. Water is released further down the river at a number of selected points but no water is released into the first four kilometres below the dam.

Furthermore my reading of the "Lower Canning River surface water allocation plan" leads me to believe that this important section of the river will be largely overlooked and that the Department of Water does not have a plan to release water into this part of the river in the foreseeable future.

The focus of my correspondence with them has been that this is unacceptable and that this section should not be sacrificed when water is being released just four kilometres downstream at Araluen.

My contention is that water should be released at the dam and that the whole river should be kept alive and flowing.

In the last two years I have corresponded with the Department of Water and successfully encouraged them to affect a limited release of water from the Dam into this section of the river. In mid February 2010 the Department of water conducted a one- off trial release into the river below the dam but by that time the river had already been reduced to no flow and low pools hence the water released was useful in that it filled the pools and maintained the eco system but it did not create a flow on effect further downstream as much water was absorbed returning the river to an adequate level. For this summer they say that there will not be enough water to do this.

This situation is now becoming critical and because this section of the river is being forsaken in the "Lower Canning River Surface Water Allocation Plan" it is now urgent.

I have conveyed my concerns to our local councillors who are also addressing the situation through their committees and processes.

Hopefully a combined effort will lead to a more consistent and positive outcome for the benefit of the river and all concerned.

The Department has been able to increase releases but they had advised that this increase cannot be maintained. It is critical that there is sufficient water remaining for the aquatic life remaining in the river, I believe the majority of extractors are doing the right thing but there are obviously a few who could do better.

# The Canning River & Environmental Releases

The Canning Dam was completed in 1940. Around this time, there was considerable concern amongst downstream landowners that the dam would reduce the quantity of water available for their use.

The government of the day gave assurances that the summer flow into the Canning River would be released for the irrigation of existing commercial orchards and other agricultural pursuits. As land use changed and the original lots were subdivided, additional demand was placed on the river system culminating in the Rights in Water & Irrigation Act (1914) in 1942 making non-riparian use subject to licensing.

Water is still released into the Canning River via environmental release points. These are located on Stinton Creek (within Araluen Botanic Park), Hill 60 (at the end of Stocker Rd, under the bridge on Orlando Rd Kelmscott, Manning Ave in Martin and under the Gosnells Rd Bridge on Albany Highway. All of these except the release point in Araluen are chlorinated water.

The release points are turned on in late spring when flows begin to recede and have primarily been used in the past to satisfy the irrigation demand along the river. Each release point is managed separately and turned on by the Water Corporation upon request by the Waters & Rivers Commission. The environmental releases contribute significantly to summer and autumn flows.

Water releases are maintained until autumn rains replenish the flow. They cease during large summer storms events, as experienced in January 2000, or when the closest upstream release point is providing adequate flow.

It should be noted that since the decline in rainfall levels since 1975 and additional demand on dams to supply water to the growing Perth community, the Canning Dam has not overflowed into the Canning River since 1974. There is also a pump back station that pumps water from upstream of the McNess Rd Bridge back into the Canning Dam. The headwaters of the Canning River now originate from small

tributaries, many of which are regulated.

Due to the lack of water this year the environmental release point in Araluen Botanic Park is running at half that of the previous years.

Araluen Botanic Park irrigates solely from our dam on the northeast corner of the Park. This is fed via the springs that occur in the Irymple Rd Orchards that feed down the valleys from the north and north east of Araluen. Generally this is enough water to get through the year but with lower rainfall, water is a scarce resource and as such our horticultural team works very hard to ensure we maximise every drop Information has come from "Caring For The Canning", Swan River Trust, 2002 Grant Nixon

## Progress on Senfors Housing

# Beware Apple Imports

#### The Local Hills Orchard Improvement Group apple growers are calling on locals to choose locally grown apples over cheaper, imported Chinese apples.

Many who live in our region are proud of our orcharding heritage – and much of this has been based on our excellent production of a wide variety of apples. However this could all be at risk following the arrival of the first Chinese apples to enter Australia. They have been labelled as 'Great Wall Apples' with no marker showing their country of origin.

Local IGA co-owner Ross Anile sits on the state and natioanl boards of Metcash. He is keen to let locals know that their policy is to buy and sell local (ie Western Australian) produce wherever possible. That means that Chinese apples will be unlikely to be seen on the shelves at our Local IGA in the near future. Price is not the only determinant in purchasing and Mr Anile (who grew up on an orchard in the local area) is keen to support local growers wherever possible. 'Price is a consideration yet when we purchase any fresh produce, quality taste is of the

upmost importance. The hills orchards produce fruit of a world class standard.' Mr Anile said.

Many local farmers feel that they will not be able to compete with the cheap imports. There is already a very slim profit margin in fruit growing and many farmers feel that if this is reduced they may as well tear up their trees. This will be a tragedy for the area.

The local industry is "very worried" about the impact of these imports. Their labour costs are far lower. Industry leaders are also worried about aspects of the production of the apples. China has pests that are unknown or still rare in Western Australia. Also there are different (or no) regulations on the production of the apples in regard to fertilisers and chemicals. Consumers may be unaware of the ethics of the apple's production and they may be inadvertently consuming dangerous chemicals.

## **GARDENING NOTES JEAN: 9397 5547**

#### This weekend, I took time out to visit some of the advertised open gardens.

Firstly we visited one in Kelmscott 'Elweme', a large paved garden with many rustic and rusty spots of old farm and harbour artefacts, beautifully maintained and well mulched. I'm not sure on reflection if I saw any of the natural soil.

There were a lot of shady areas from trees which had been planted by previous owners over twenty years prior to the present gardeners occupation and development of this garden.

I had heard of the garden several years ago, when a customer at Pioneer gardens Nursery had described it to me. The Lagerstroemia, "Crepe Myrtle" grown as standards gave a lovely light floral contrast. Next at Walpole, we ventured to Red Tingle Drive, where two adjoining gardens were open.

The weather was cool and we enjoyed a slight amount of rain, soft enough to cool but not to make us too wet. 'Hidden Springs' was a very controlled garden, with netting over the entire orchard area, and absolutely perfect fruit for sale. We had a sausage sizzle snack liberally festooned with onion and sat watching all the birds from a viewing point on the veranda. Blue wrens, red finches, wattlebirds and smaller honey-eaters and one red capped parrot, Bill had lots of caged feeders so the little birds could get the food but the bigger



Also hanging there was a watering point which contained honey. I noticed flowering ginger plants, Metrosiderous trees, lots of roses and the healthiest fuchsia hedge I've ever seen and a lush vegetable garden.

Patsy and David's garden was a 'plantsperson's' garden, much more relaxed and rambly, with a lovely selection of various grouped plants. They had three large dams, with marron in one and the other with lots of yabbies. I felt very relaxed and at home wandering in this garden and enjoyed the peaceful ambience of the family oriented garden; a truly lived in family home. With their veggie garden and fruit orchard I think they would have been self-sufficient.

By the time we reached my friend's beautiful garden in Albany we were able to enjoy the garden near nightfall before the rain set in. They had 32mm over-night. As we drove back to Roleystone we used windscreen wipers all the way to Bannister, then it was dusk and no more rain.

During the drive we stopped at the Red Cross Opportunity shop in Mount Barker and I re-stocked my garden books supply. Many times when anabolic steroids are purchased from a dealer, they are actually a product intended for use on animals rather than the variety intended for humans. There is no 'safe dose' for anabolic steroid use, but excessive doses heighten the side effects.

If you are a parent or partner of someone who may be using, try to educate the user about the side effects. Remember, perceived benefits of steroid use NEVER out-weigh the risk to your body and NEVER last after you finish taking them! You'd be better off spending your money on a personal trainer. # Theatre's Bling Ball



The Southern Brown Bandicoot or Quenda is a small marsupial that is frequently seen in this area and in other urban areas near bushland. These delightful creatures can grow up to the size of a small rabbit (2kg) although females will be smaller. They have a compact body, a pointed face and a short, stiff tail. Sometimes Bandicoots can be mistaken for rats which are long and

lean with a very long tail, also rats tend to run and scurry whilst Bandicoots have a hopping gait.

Wild Gossip

Bandicoots are generally solitary by nature and will defend their home range. Their diet is mainly invertebrates, small vertebrates and some plants though in urban areas their diet can also include fruit, seeds and even pet food. Bandicoots will breed at any time of year when food is abundant. The female will give birth to up to 4 young about 2 weeks after mating. These babies will be carried in a backward facing pouch that sometimes gets so big it trails on the ground.

After weaning, the young Bandicoots will move off and attempt to establish their own home ranges. One of the main threats to Bandicoots is predators such as cats, dogs and foxes, the young being particularly at risk.

Another main threat to Bandicoots is the loss of suitable habitat due to land clearing and competition for space and food with other animals. We can help by making part of our gardens 'Bandicoot friendly' by planting low native shrubs, creating pockets of dense vegetation, offering hollow logs and pipes etc to provide nesting sites and cover. Bandicoots do occasionally dig in garden beds and lawns in search of grubs and beetles,

## Pro Bono: "Eggs" **David Bardsley Minister Community Church**



Dear Friends

When you think about it, eggs are marvellous things. Even if you don't think about it, they're still marvellous. Fed on scraps and scratchings, a hen produces one of these ovaloid (well, egg shaped) things and pops it out of her undercarriage every twenty fours. They taste delicious and do you heaps of good ... in moderation! Consumed in excessive numbers they can do vou a lot of harm. We know. We've been to Berliste and experienced these things.

It was early in our venture into the villages around Oravita in SW Romania and we were calling on various families (mainly in the village of Berliste), led by the local church minister. Being subsistence farmers, these country folk had next to no money but plenty of food in season. Without a cash income, education for their children was seriously curtailed because they couldn't afford to meet the costs involved with attending high school. We were getting to know the situation first hand so we could channel funds from the UK appropriately and see these bright youngsters achieve their full potential. Needless to say we were welcomed with open arms...and lots of eggs! In their culture, hospitality towards visitors was very important. A meal of some sort was always produced even if we weren't expected. As it was that difficult time before harvest and after most of last year's stored food had gone, their larders were rather bare and there was no time to kill off a chicken for meat. So they fell back on their reserves of evil little black sausages accompanied by eggs which the hens faithfully produced each day. By four o'clock in the afternoon we had met five families, had five "meals" and consumed at least 10 eggs! We were longing (dying?) to say "Thanks, but no thanks." However our guide warned us that turning down their hospitality would be very offensive - they were offering us all they had.

Their insistence on feeding us stems back to the days when food was very scarce and visitors were often genuinely hungry. The culture of hospitality was grounded in making sure people were taken care of even if they were strangers. The obvious need was food but the concern went far beyond mere material provision. Have we lost some of this? In our comfortable, self centred existence, it's all too easy to turn a blind eye to the needs of those around us. It might not be food people require, although some children still arrive at our schools not having had a proper breakfast. More often those who cross our paths have different needs, friendship for a start. When Jesus affirmed the great commandment to love your neighbour as yourself, he was effectively saying reach out the hand of friendship to all who you meet, even if it is costly. Let's do more of that. You never know, we may even see depression disappear from our community.

#### Assisting Pets-Understanding Heartworm Judith Congrene

#### Many pet owners admit they are confused about when and how to worm their dogs and cats – one of the biggest areas of uncertainty is heartworm prevention – is it necessary?

Many discussions during a home visit include the comment "but we didn't have to give medication to prevent heartworm before".

When I first started out in private practice as a new graduate 25 years ago, Heartworm was not prevalent in Perth but was just starting to be talked about as a new risk to dogs. It was well known over East and particularly in the northern parts of Australia. One of the biggest factors for the spread of heartworm across Australia has probably been the increased tendency of people to take their dogs on long caravaning trips around Australia or to travel interstate for work, taking their pets with him to their new home.

Heartworm is a parasitic worm that is spread in its larval form by mosquitoes. When the infected mosquito bites the dog or cat, it injects the larvae into the animal and these develop into young worms that move down the blood vessels to live in the heart, lungs and surrounding blood vessels in dogs and cats, becoming adult worms after about 6 months. These worms can cause severe damage to the heart and lungs of the infected animals, as well as blocking the vital flow of blood.

Many things have changed in the last 25 years and as a result of the greater incidence and risk of heartworm disease in our dogs and cats, I would strongly recommend the pet owner in 2011 ensures their pet is treated to prevent heartworm infection.

# Astronomical Highlights Feb

You can mark the seasons by the appearance

or disappearance of certain bright stars or

distinctive star groups - it's been done

for millennia. Not so with the planets

(wanderers). For instance, Jupiter's

dominating the western sky at dusk now.

Don't expect it to be in the same position

at this time next year. For me, it's good to

see the Southern Cross back in view now in

the early evening. Can you find the Cross

(Crux) for yourself? Look SSE around

9pm. It's a pattern of stars that looks like

a kite lying on its side. Very high up above

Crux and somewhat to the right is the False

Cross - it's below and to the left of the

bright star Canopus which is due south and

really high up. In the neighbourhood of the

Cross there are several objects that we like

to feature in the evening viewing sessions at

Under the heading of backyard astronomy,

we also show some of the main constellations

and talk about principles such as the Bayer

system for naming stars. In the early

1600s, Johannes Bayer came up with a

way of naming stars using the letters of the

Greek alphabet. The brightest star gets an

alpha, the second brightest a beta, then a

gamma, and so on. Looking at the Cross,

find Alpha Crucis – it's the star on the

right, the one that's at the foot of the Cross

when it's standing upright (which it does

the Observatory.

Greg Lowe Perth Observatory

Crucis, going clockwise,

the stars in Crux are arranged in order of decreasing brightness: Beta Crucis, Gamma Crucis, Delta Crucis, and the very faint Epsilon Crucis. A-Cross, B-Cross, C-Cross, D-Cross, E-Cross. Easy.

Jupiter's the bright "star" in the west at nightfall. Over the coming fortnight it'll be setting earlier and earlier. By mid-month we'll lose it in the Sun's glare. Then there'll be no visible planet at the start of the night. Saturn's rising in the east around 10:40pm now, and will come up earlier by about 4 minutes with each passing day: around 9:45pm mid-month, and 8:50 by month's end. It'll be the "star" of the show at the Observatory in autumn. Venus continues as the brilliant "morning star", rising in the ESE at about 2:30am now, 2:45 midmonth, and 3am at the end of the month. You can't mistake it: look east at dawn.

Moon phases: new moon on the 3rd, first quarter the 11th, full moon the 18th, last quarter the 25th (a.m.), and new moon again on March 5th. Teachers: evening moon obs should be conducted from the 4th or 5th to the 18th or 19th. From a day or two after new moon until full moon or the day after .... remember?
