


September Cover

Tanking is a recent word that has come into the sporting lexicon.


In AFL terms it means not playing your best; so that you can get a better draft pick. It also means that you win a reverse premiership the Wooden Spoon award, plus the best draft too.

VALE Reg Jones

Reginald George Jones was born at Subiaco on January 18, 1927 to Elizabeth and Joseph Jones of Tuart Hill. He was the 3rd eldest of seven children. Reg grew up around the Tuart Hill area. At thirteen he started work on dairy farms, rising at 5am each day to attend work. In those days Tuart Hill and surrounding suburbs was bush and swamp. Reg was keen on horses and enjoyed the thrill of catching and breaking in wild brumbies.

In his late teens Reg set up a team of labourers to do fencing contracting. This meant that they were on the road for months at a time, the work was tough and involved roughing it under the stars.

Eventually he ended up in Mukinbudin where he met a young local woman by the name of Norma Corunna, who he later married in 1958.

At that point Reg settled down, finding employment working as a farmhand. As the family grew all the children would eventually be introduced to fencing, including his daughters. In his mind it was a way of connecting with his children and at the same time instil good work ethics. He would often say a good hard ďay's work didn't kill anybody.

Reg's family always came first, he often worked 7 days a week to ensure they were fed and provided with a roof over their head. He encouraged all his children in their endeavours including sport, this was the only time he would take off work to ensure they had his full support.

Throughout his working life Reg was regarded in the community as a hard working family man who strived to offer his children opportunities which were not readily available in his era of growing up. After UNOFFICIALLY retiring Reg found it difficult to hang up the boots and generated all his energy into creating an impressive vegetable garden at the bottom of a granite outcrop on the farm which included fruit trees. There was an abundance of fresh vegetables to be given to family and friends. Reg was extremely proud of his achievements in this area.

He then moved to Perth and Reg did seasonal work at the local Bettenay orchard. This marks his move and connection to Roleystone. He enjoyed the peace of the orchard which obviously reminded him of



the serenity he experienced working on the fence line. He developed a friendship with the owners Vern, Margaret and Kim Bettenay and continued to do this work until his arthritis worsened and made it impossible to use secateurs.

Reg would often be seen at the local community football matches or having a chat in the car park.

Eventually his illness would become so severe he was no longer able to enjoy an active or independent life. True to Reg's nature he put up a gallant fight but eventually succumbed to the silent illness that plagued his body and passed away peacefully with Norma and family by his side.

Finally in his honour Reg would like to express his deep gratitude to Colleen and Joseph for the times he resided with them and especially to Jocelyn and Ian for taking care of him and Baby-girl in his final days.

Eighteen months ago in February 2011, Kevin and his parents had been saved by his brother Sean as deadly fire engulfed their home. Sean had seen the smoke and the fire approaching and went to get the dogs in. As he raced to his parent's home, the area around their home was already on fire. Kevin, who is reliant on a wheelchair, was in bed and Sean realised there was no time to get him properly dressed as he lifted him onto his shoulders, gathered his parents and headed outside towards the creek. As he left the home flames were all about; he noticed the cars, the veranda and the roof of the home were all on fire. Sadly two dogs could not be saved but Sean acted to get his brother and his parents out of immediate danger. They were saved by a fire crew from Bedfordale who arrived in the nick of time. The family saved almost nothing from their home as they had no time to prepare. Now their home has been rebuilt and the family are overjoyed to be back home. It is spacious, all new and sparkling and has a commanding view over the hills.

Sean reflects that: 'Lots of people need to be thanked for their help and donations. Our particular thanks go to Armadale Lions and Rotary clubs for donating to Kevin a brand new state of the art four wheel drive wheel chair. It is just so good to have them all home. This is especially for Kevin as he can now get on with his life.'



Messages to our Children

As a parent I am mindful about messages given to my children.

On several occasions I have been approached by boys at the local shop for sponsorship of the Roleystone Community College School Fun Run to be held in September. This Fun Run is Corporately Sponsored and designed to raise money for the School. Normally I would not hesitate to donate money to such a cause, however I am not quite sure that the motivation for these boys is one of charitable fundraising for the School. Rather I suspect their motivation is for the prize they will receive according to how much money they raise. My children have also asked me to sponsor them so that they too can receive a new toy. One can hardly blame them as this is exactly what the sponsorship form instructs them to do! "Choose your Prize and Set your Goal" is boldly outlined in the pamphlet. In other words the more money they raise the better the "prize" they can expect to receive. For example this can range from a sports watch for \$10 raised, right up to an Apple IPod for up \$600 raised. I have a fundamental problem with this concept.

The act of fundraising and charitable donation (for community services such as our School) builds community spirit through a common shared goal and should be encouraged in our children. This new concept has turned the very idea of fundraising on its head and changed the intent to one whereby children are in it for "what's in it for me". After all an Apple I Pod or a brand new Wii Console is pretty hard to resist! To my mind the reward from fundraising should not be material but far greater rewards that teach them about the pleasure of giving (without expectation) and community spirit. Perhaps the School will initially receive more money (due to the children's extra motivators) but I would like to suggest that the easy way is not always the best way and there will be hidden longer

I wonder how many people donating through this scheme will be aware that only 60% of their money will be given to the school and a further 30% taken to purchase these "prizes"? Furthermore I am concerned about how aware/ informed the public is about the message they will be reinforcing to the children who they are donating through?

We have decided to donate our Fun Run money directly to Roleystone Community College, bypassing the fund raiser (the School will receive 100% of our money). We wish to reinforce the concept of what fundraising is about to our children and support our School, however it will be undoubtedly difficult for them to watch other children receiving their "prize". It is a quandary.

How about the next year the school has another fun run in which the goal (improved common facilities) is shared and we bypass a corporate Fund Raiser where a large proportion of the donations goes towards motivational prizes? Only then can we all avoid giving mixed messages to our children and truly enjoy the spirit of what fundraising is all about.

The tours of the nurseries made the growers aware of the new varieties soon to become available. It also showed us the challenges of breeding large, good quality fruit.

The trip also included tours of huge pack houses and fruit markets, to see the process of how the fruit is packed out and transported to the markets and then later sold. The trip also included some finer moments, as seen in the picture of the group in front of the Palace of Fine Arts.

Commercial Growers Ask for Support

Still in response to Mr. Peter J Stewart (Letter to editor June 2012), I thank him for the confidence shown to us. We are a commercial grower of stone fruit facing the struggle of doing so without any really effective defence against Medfly infestation. Mr Stewart credited us with the ability to persist and thrive in the light of this decision by the APVMA to remove our only effective tool to control fruit fly. However, Mr Stewart, though we will persist and work from dawn to dusk with the additional requirements of continual baiting and orchard hygiene to try to keep our orchards Medfly free, it will be for naught. Unfortunately Medfly do not respect the fences. They will continue to fly in from outside.

Perth Hills is in the (in this case unfortunate) situation, of being closely entwined with the community. An aerial shot of our area sent Medfly experts running. The Department themselves admit that it is no use for us to "bust our gut" in this manner when there are still so many unmanaged trees in such close proximity to our orchards.

Hence the call for all those people who have fruit trees in their backyards to have a good think about it. Do you take the necessary steps to control Medfly? Do you really need that tree, or does it just give you fruit fly riddled fruit anyway? The greatest support you can give us is to remove the tree and all threat of it harbouring fly.

We also call for the Department of Conservation and Land Management to assist us in this. The area opposite the Black Cockatoo Rehabilitation Centre on Mills Rd, now under the management of the Department of Conservation, has recently been replanted with native trees, which is to be applauded. This was an orchard in the past and had been left to disintegrate. However they have left approx 10-20 citrus, mandarins and pears as well as some loquat trees. In the light of the local Hill's orchardists fight against Med Fly these need to be removed.

Unfortunately the May editorial was right, and it is not an exaggeration to say that this decision may well be the ruin of the local orchardists.



RESPONSE TO GOVERNMENT RESPONSE: RE TULIP FESTIVAL

TO THE SENIOR SPOKESPERSON FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT. We are very happy to hear that the Department of Environment and Conservation believe they are working closely with the Araluen Botanic Park Foundation and the City of Armadale to ensure the ongoing viability of this Park. Two points remain unclear:

a) what are the reported issues

b) what is the alleged 'dissention from the community' that enforced the decision not to promote or advertise the tulips as a 'festival'?

Yes, we agree that a trial period for parking and traffic arrangements would be useful, but would it not be more efficacious to do an evaluation of the parking after the actual festival was promoted and advertised? We believe this would generate a more realistic result and idea of the true traffic situation.

Furthermore, it has come to our attention that the normal gate entry fee cannot be raised, as has been done in past years to cover costs for maintaining the Park.

We do believe in full support of the Araluen Tulip Festival but cannot comprehend this decision, as it does not seem to encourage or assist the Araluen Botanic Park Foundation in its endeavor to ensure the ongoing viability of the Park.

Currently the decisions taken by your Department do not support your contention that you are working closely with the Foundation and the City of Armadale or that you wish to promote Araluen Botanic Park and ensure its long term viability.

In light of the debate raging about White Tailed Black Cockatoos' recent actions in eating apple seed from local orchards over the last apple season, The Black Cockatoo Society housed at Karaakin in Martin, wishes to advise that their program of rehabilitation of injured birds does not involve feeding the birds apples. The Centre is aware that native birds need to be able to fend for themselves in their natural environment so they are fed on natural items - mainly marri nuts. Apples are not fed to cockatoos that are rehabilitated and released.

The Centre does have a number of 'derelict' birds that are fed apples but these birds will not be released and are used for education and promotional purposes.

When Fact is Stranger Than Fiction My Family Roots

In the early hours of 10 August I returned from a 6 week holiday in Europe. I went on this trip for three reasons – Le Tour De France, my 60th birthday and to meet some of my European family members. Sadly my camera was stolen just 2 days before returning to Australia and I lost all my photographs so I will not talk too much about the race or my travels. This story is about my English heritage.

As a young girl my grandmother, Betty Evens, always tried to tell me that I was 'a young lady' and to 'act like it'. I always knew that she came from a very 'well heeled family' and I had a faint knowledge of some prestigious awards won by members of the family but this came into perspective when I stayed with my cousin Rosemary and her husband John Edridge.

My Great Great Grandfather, Sir George Paget was Regius Professor of Physics from 1872-92 at Cambridge University. The whole structure of the school of medicine changed when he became the head as only about 4 students were qualifying as doctors but they weren't seriously taken by other universities. The structure is still used today. Sir George suggested that the medical students should carry out practical examinations on patients which was the beginning of this practice all over the world.

His son Owen Paget MD is my Great Grandfather. His sister Rose Paget married Sir Joseph John Thomson (Rosemary's grandparents) who was the Master of Trinity College and won a Nobel Physics Prize 1906 "in recognition of the great merits of his theoretical investigations on the conduction of electricity by gases". His ashes and those of Aunt Rose are buried in Westminster Abbey.

My Great Great Grandfather's younger brother was also a doctor and was Queen Victoria's personal physician. His name was Sir James Paget. She made him a baron and the title has been carried on to the current Baron, Sir Julian Paget. James discovered 2 forms of cancer

which are both called Paget's disease. Sir JJ Thomson's, son Sir George Paget Thomson was the Master of Corpus Christi College and he, jointly with Sir Clinton Joseph Davisson, won a Nobel Physics Prize "for their experimental discovery of the diffraction of electrons by crystals."

My cousin David Thomson, son of George Thomson is married to Patience the daughter and granddaughter of Sir William Lawrence Bragg and Sir William Henry Bragg. This father and son team also won Nobel Physics Prizes together "for their services in the analysis of crystal structure by means of x-rays." Alice Springs was named after Patience's Great Grandmother and

her Great Grandfather was the man who installed the telegraph wire from Adelaide to Darwin.

Sir George was one of my grandmother's grandfathers ,the other was Rev. Astley Cooper.

His son Rev Sir John Astley Cooper was the instigator of the Empire Games now known as the Commonwealth Games!

Although this is just the tip of iceberg of our family history, I can understand what my grandmother meant when I was growing up. This was hard for me to understand as she never really talked about her upbringing. Now I know!

This ancestry is shared by members of the Hay, Agar, Hatfield and Kiffin-Petersen families with numerous members across the Roleystone area.

Local business owners are devastated after fire destroyed their shops with estimates of over \$1 million worth of damage. The fire broke out in the Brookton Valley Grower Super Market just after 1.30 early on Sunday morning 19th August and soon spread to other shops in the Brookton Valley Shopping complex.

The super market has sustained the most damage but the ceiling across the complex is badly affected and Kim Valley Chinese Restaurant, Karizma Hair Salon and Holly's Skin and Beauty Salon all sustained extensive smoke and water damage.

This is unbelievably frustrating and devastating for these business owners who all felt unbelievably lucky when their business narrowly escaped destruction from the February 2011 fires.

Our hearts go out to all of the

people affected. The owners, their staff and the many loyal customers who have frequented these shops over the years.

So where to now for these business owners and their staff? Suzzie Wilson from Karizma was overwhelmed: 'you work so hard to set up a business and it can be destroyed just like that,' she reflected. Suzzie and her staff from Karizma have managed to negotiate an alternative location with a salon available in a small complex in Huntingdale.

'It is only 12 minutes away from the Karizma salon' said Suzzie. 'There is easy access and excellent parking and we hope to be able to cater for our clients in about three weeks. Please call us on 9390 7506 or visit my face book page for updates.'

Suzzie wants to assure clients that Karizma will return to the Brookton Valley site when it is rebuilt. 'This community has been so great and I have been offered so much support. It is amazing.'

Holly Smailes was shattered; her beautiful salon was blackened and smoke damaged and all her stock was ruined.

'I am getting married in two weeks so I will try to clean things up and sort out the mess and then hopefully find somewhere else to practice until the complex is rebuilt.' Holly said. 'Our thanks to everyone who has offered assistance or just moral support, it has been overwhelming."

Kim from Kim Valley Chinese Restaurant wants to take some time to decide what he should do next. Over the next few weeks he is just going to attempt to salvage what he can and 'sort out the mess'. Then he is planning to take a break before making the decision about what to do with his business. This is grave news to the multitude of customers who have enjoyed his Chinese food over many years.

The Valley Grower Super Mart owner Huy Duc Nguyen and his family only opened their newly refurbished business in October 2010. Their store is totally destroyed and so they must decide what direction they take now.

We wish them all the best of luck over the next few difficult months while they make decisions and rebuild and thank them all for the wonderful service they have provided to us over the years.





With the ban on cover sprays coming into place this season the only way local growers will be able to fight Medfly (Mediterranean fruit fly) is through an area-wide management strategy. Medfly is the most important insect pest for the fruit industry in WA, and is particularly a problem in the Perth Hills.

Dr Sonya Broughton from the Department of Agriculture and Food said: 'Without access to the traditional insecticides dimethoate and fenthion, our research indicates that area-wide management is the only strategy in most situations that will enable growers to produce fruit free of Medfly.'

Medfly control on hobby farms and in backyards many kilometres distant becomes more important to orchardists trying to harvest crops of apricots, nectarines and peaches.

Local Roleystone commercial fruit growers Tim and Adrian Byl have an orchard that is surrounded by local homes and hobby farms.

'It is of utmost importance for the community to fully back this fight against Medfly, as history has shown that without an effective cover spray, it is pretty much impossible to control. It will be an uphill battle for the commercial growers to exist without these sprays - even the department admits 100% losses of some crops could occur.' Adrian Byl said.

Department of Agricualture and Food has indicated that Roleystone has too many unmanaged fruit trees for it to be effective.'

'Trapping and baiting on its own is not enough to control Medfly. This is because they are only aimed to lure and kill the adult fly, which could be done AFTER they have stung several pieces of fruit. Without the cover spray there is nothing that will kill the larvae and so the cycle continues and an outbreak could occur.'

'We are very concerned with how we are to be expected to produce quality fruit when there is little we can do in the event of an outbreak.' Tim Byl said.

'We run our orchard under IPM (Integrated Pest Management) and try to use as little chemical as possible. We have found that baiting and trapping is definitely not enough on its own as we had to resort to cover sprays to save various blocks from huge losses.'

'So if locals want to continue to eat locally grown fresh produce, please bait your fruit trees three times a week, pick up any dropped fruit and treat it, trap and monitor Medfly, or remove your fruit trees and support your local growers and save the industry!!'

Locals should take note that citrus, figs and loquats harbour for Medfly over winter - so these need treatment

Community baiting schemes used to exist in our area but were discontinued when cover spraying was so effective and costs became prohibitive.

The Department of Agriculture will be demonstrating at the Karragullen Expo how to make your own traps. Fruit fly traps are available at Hills Cold Stores 9293 7152 and A Giumelli & Sons 9293







Water Wise after a Dry Winter Helen Morton MLC Member for East Metropolitan Region



One of the great pleasures of living in the Perth Hills is visiting the lovely picnic sites; however for those of us who have recently visited the Canning Dam, you could not have helped but notice just how low the Dam's water line now sits.

In July Perth received only 34.6mm of rain for the whole month, making it our driest July on record, with the previous record being 61.5mm of rain for July 1876.

The local effect is that monthly total rainfall for the Canning Dam is only 41.4mm; far below the 181mm average for the month.

Unfortunately, all of our metropolitan dams are recording similarly low rainfall figures and with the Weather Bureau warning that the dry weather is set to continue, managing our water consumption is becoming even more critical.

Hopefully, none of us need reminding that the winter sprinkler ban has been on from June 1 and will be in force for 3 months. Across the state, this initiative has already saved billions of litres (3.7 billion just last year) so please stick with it and remember that it applies to users of scheme water, garden bores and more than 600 licensed

bore owners.

Beyond the sprinkler ban, there are many ways that we can reduce our water usage around the home and this includes the "Showerhead Swap Program", which allows Perth residents to swap 2 old showerheads for a highly efficient showerhead for free. Since showers make up around 22% of total household water usage, this is an easy and effective way to save water and keep your bills down. A brochure with the full details on the Program should be enclosed in your next water use account from the Water

GARDENING NOTES JEAN: 9397 5547

Rain is such a blessing although I don't like the gusty wind. The wet weather makes it possible to stop weeding and spend time at my computer. I hope you all have your roses pruned by now, next month it will be time to prune Hibiscus. At least there are no prickles on them.

If your Camellias need shaping or are getting too big, then pick your flowers going back into the hardwood, then give them a dressing of 9-month slow release fertiliser.

Neutrog have bought out a new Camellia–Azalea fertiliser. It has been extensively trialled in South Australia and some areas on the east coast but I do not know what the soil quality is over there and will not recommend it until I have used it. They have started trialling it at Araluen.

The Roleystone Gardening Group had a lovely outing to LYNDHURST Road in KALAMUNDA to visit an orchid nursery. Jill had previously been there and so recommended it when Joyce suggested going to see orchids. My own orchid which Linda gave me a few years ago has three lovely sprays of flowers, I'm not so partial to the big cymbidiums but these orchids were mainly the spray types with smaller flowers, in tight clusters. We all came home with plants and I have distributed flyers advertising the Cannington Orchid show this weekend. Next month we will meet at Phillips Art Gallery and car pool to Bob's home in Mt Nasura. As always our meeting is on the third Thursday in the month at 10-00am. Bob has promised Pumpkin Soup.

I have been doing quite a bit of gardening at the home in Bassendean that used to belong to my parents. It has been rented

out over the past few years and

certain plants have grown in the wrong places and others have outgrown their spaces. I took down a clump of snowflakes that Margaret gave me a number of years ago and planted them in the planter box out the front, only to discover that mum had planted these over the years and they are thriving out the back. There are also a number of daffodils. I had managed the garden for Mum for many years whilst she lived there. During that time I had put in Gerberas and Penstemons (these have continued to grow) and the daylilies and nasturtiums are prolific. All the vegies should be starting to grow healthily and I'm certain many of you are enjoying munching your way around the garden. Protect against slugs and snails and those caterpillar grubs which enjoy a munch



Pro Bono: Religious Wine

David Bardsley, Minister Community Church



Dear Friends
I visited some friends recently and to
my astonishment was offered a glass
of "religious wine" on the basis that I
was a "religious person".

It was a remarkably good drop though there was nothing sacred about it at all. But the comment did prompt discussion on Biblical references to wine and where the idea of total abstinence came from. I believe it emerged years ago as a pendulum swing against the degradation and horrors of severe alcohol abuse, particularly the consumption of gin by those at the bottom of the social pile.

Christian leaders took a stand and vowed never to drink alcohol in their fight to obliterate the terrible trade. It was social action prompted by the Biblical call to protect the exploited and abused.

When I left the very hospitable friends' home I pondered on the religious label I had been given. I had a bit of an itch because I don't actually see myself as a religious person. From my perspective a religious person is one who is good at "religion" itself and that in turn is all about rituals and rites - doing the "right" things and saying the "right" words as laid down by some overarching authority. It's the outward, visible workings of something which may or may not have a deeper meaning for the person performing them. And it's that deeper, inner stuff which is most important to me - that's about faith, not religion.

My faith revolves around my

relationships with God and with those around me. And there is something extra special about my relationship with those who also believe in Jesus Christ. They are my spiritual family. I revel in the sense of identity it gives me - I belong somewhere special, in fellowship with other believers. In fact it is these people that define "Church", not the building or even the religious stuff we do in the building. In many ways we are like a team, each individual with a different identity and different skills and abilities but through our relational links we endeavour to do what Jesus said we should do love God, love your neighbour, love yourself...three pretty simple things

To use a cycling analogy, we get a medal when we do these three things. Fancy religious practice is like having the best bike and wearing the right brand of trainers, the best helmet and lycra shorts and the best style of riding etc. But it's no use someone being kitted out superbly if they don't get out there and race no matter how good they look. Incidentally, someone once told me that male racing cyclists shave their legs to reduce air resistance, not to look good - okay? It's actually much easier to look the part than to participate in the sport, any sport for that matter. Loving God, loving your neighbour, loving yourself aren't always actions done by folk who look good. Living out our Christian faith authentically can be distinctly messy, not at all like the refined and defined religious practices we sometimes identify with church. But the analogy breaks down. Life is a journey not a race and we don't earn a winner's medal. Jesus earned all the medals for all of us. There is indeed one for everybody who walks in the right direction whether or not they look

Religious wine? My friends finally confessed that it was a glass of cheap cleanskin plonk which I had enjoyed so much. Ah well, confession is one religious practice which is always good for the soul!





Astronomical Highlights September

September is an equinox month. The gradual return of the sun to the southern hemisphere means longer days, and warmer weather. My wife only just manages to survive winter, admittedly by spending a month of it up in the northern hemisphere. It would be cheaper to keep her home and crank up the heating, in spite of the spiralling cost of electricity.

But, back to the equinox story: it's on September 22nd. At 11pm on the 22nd the sun will be briefly in the same plane as the Earth's equator.

At equinox times, sunrise occurs due east and sunset due west. This applies only at equinox times, i.e. around September 22nd and March 20th.

When I was a kid, my parents and teachers persisted in stating the rule of thumb that the sun rises in the east and sets in the west and passes overhead at noon. Rubbish! The variation of sunrise from due east and sunset from due west is about +/- 28 degrees here in the Perth region: a total shift of 56 degrees, between the extremes of the summer and winter solstices. What's more, the sun never gets to be directly overhead. The closest it gets is 9 degrees from the zenith, at the summer solstice. Near enough, you might say. But at the winter solstice it gets no higher than 35 degrees up, and that's at local noon. If you go further south, the winter sun is even lower.

The moon's the dominant evening object

at the beginning of September, being full on the night of August 31st - September 1st.

The evening planets aren't exactly eyecatching. At dusk in early September Saturn's well up in the western sky, with the star Spica just below and to the left of it. At the same time Mars is up above the two of them, and getting further from them day by day. By the last week of the month, Spica and Saturn are setting in the evening twilight. On the other hand, Mars hangs in much the same position all month. Its setting times are about 10:15pm in early September, 10pm midmonth, and 9:50pm by month's end.

Jupiter and Venus are the brightest starlike objects in the morning sky. Now that it's on the wane, the moon will also be a morning object. In the very early morning of the 9th, the moon will pay Jupiter a brief visit. On the 13th at daybreak the waning crescent moon will be near Venus. Jupiter's rising now at about 1:30am in the ENE. By mid-month it's rising around 12:40am, and by month's end it's rising at about midnight. At daybreak it's well up in the northern sky. Venus is brilliant and rises around 4:15am all month; at daybreak you'll find it low in the NE sky. The major phases of the moon for September are the last quarter on the 8th, the new moon on the 16th, the first quarter on the 23rd, and the full moon on the 30th.

Wild Gossip: Wild Ducklings

Spring is here and so are ducklings in abundance. They can be seen all around the area happily following mum, running under her and swimming with her.

Sometimes Mum and some or all of her ducklings become separated or Mum has an accident and the ducklings become orphans. Young ducklings are totally reliant on Mum for warmth, protection and the vital oils to keep them waterproof so without her they need urgent help to survive.

If you find orphaned or abandoned ducklings the first thing to do is put them in a box and add a source of warmth such as a wheat pack, warm water bottle or similar then either take them to your local wildlife carer/shelter or care for them yourself.

Ducklings need secure housing like a cardboard or wooden box, with sides high enough to prevent them from jumping out. Cages are not recommended as they present too many opportunities for injuries. Bedding could be newspaper, a towel or similar, but always avoid paper from the shredder which is sharp and will result in paper cuts and any frayed materials which could cause tangling.

Warmth can be provided by a temperature controlled hot box or heat lamp.

Food is usually chick or duck starter crumbs offered in a non tip container that is small enough to prevent the ducklings from getting in and soiling. A small dish of finely chopped lettuce or grass, sprinkled with a bit of insectivore and damped is also very much enjoyed. Don't worry if ducklings don't feed for the first day or so as prior to hatching they have absorbed the last nutrients of the egg.

Water must be available in a small container that the ducklings can't get into and become wet. Special water containers are available from stock feed or pet shops or you can make you own by cutting little circular holes (10c size) in the lid of a take away container filled with water — so that the ducklings can poke their beaks through to drink but will stay dry. It may sound odd that the ducklings must remain dry when they swim on lakes but without Mum's oils and warmth they will become wet, cold and die.

As the ducklings grow and the secondary feathers start to appear they can start to spend time outside on warm days, in a secure area with water provided for bathing. Soon the ducklings will need to move to a secure pond to learn their swimming and diving skills.

Finally it is time for release and maybe a little research will be needed to find an appropriate area with adequate good water. Your local wildlife carer/shelter may be able to offer suggestions or Local Council or DEC could be consulted for advice. Always be sure to go and check a release area in advance as things could have changed since it was last checked. Please contact me for help or advice

about all orphaned or injured wildlife.


