'Riga? Where on earth is that?'

It's a common response when I meet new people. I usually have to then fill in the "geographical map" for them.

"It used to be part of the soviet block. It is the largest city in The Baltics, (Lithuania and Estonia)."

I'm sure however, that after the recent tragic shopping centre collapse in November, Riga will now have a greater profile.

So why did I travel to Riga? Well, I travelled there recently courtesy of my lovely wife Vicki, who organised the whole trip secretly for my 50th birthday. Yes, she is the world's best wife!

Riga is home to my closest long time friend Aldis Bernsteins, who I met over 30 years ago when we studied together in Perth. Aldis left Perth in 2007 to follow his heart and married a local girl, Dagnija, in Riga. They have a gorgeous daughter Matilde.

This all happened in the years since Aldy left Perth and we had not been together since then.

Suffice it to say, Aldis was a co-conspirator in this wonderful surprise. Riga, is quite simply a beautiful city. Founded in 120, you can imagine the history, and there is a bounty of it.

Cobbled streets lined with buildings that have such ornate facades that you can't take it all in at once. It is a city that embraces its achievements and is actively restoring many of these incredible structures.

It is filled with architecture that quite literally 'dazzles the senses'.

More pleasing still is the fact Riga is a relatively low rise city - with few tall monoliths that dominate and suffocate most modern cities.

Getting around Riga is no problem either. If you're travelling out of Riga, by all means take a car - but 'city to suburbs' you have a choice of Trams, Trolley Buses and Trains. The true sign of a forward thinking city.

Of course I'm a serious foodie, so I was keen to check out the markets. Well lending the words from "Crocodile

Dundee". That's not a market - THIS is a market!" The central markets of Riga are astonishing. Five converted Zeppelin Hangers from WW2 now house the most incredible array of food.

1. Fish, fresh and smoked 2. Fruit and vegetables 3. Milk and cheese 4. Dry goods and bread 5. meat!

Then of course there are the hundreds of stalls outside the pavilion! The bars and cafes are fantastic.

Walk down any cobbled lane way and you'll happen upon a cosy basement bar or cafe, nestled under incredible gothic style vaulted ceilings. Probably built in the







1500's, give or take a few centuries!

A treat for me was to feast in an authentic medieval restaurant. Rozengrals is a "real" medieval restaurant. Built in 1293 - it is candle lit; staff are dressed for the part and the food is authentic.

I saw so much in my short stay in Riga - far too much to describe in detail in just a few paragraphs. The highlights for me were definitely:

- Standing in the ruins of a Castle built in1209, where the crusades were fought.
- Experiencing the sheer opulence of a royal palace, (Rundale Palace was built in1768 for the Duke of Courland, one time lover of Catherine the Great).
- Walking through a medieval castle at night. Enjoying fruit tea while relaxing on cushions in a stunning round wooden tea house in the centre of Riga.

Riga truly is the "jewel in the crown" of Europe. I walked the length and breadth of this magical city and I did it all with my best mate - and for that I can't thank my beautiful wife enough.

THOMAS WAS IN A BIG HURRY






they even got roped in to help.





Each year I spend a day cleaning up the bush prior to the Armadale City bulk pick up day and have retrieved many ute loads at those times. I have also been successful with DEC from the Mundaring office who have collected large loads that have been dumped.

I know my area is not the only one suffering in this way and, those who bushwalk or drive in the Roleystone - Karragullen area, will know that it is widespread. The way to improve it may be

The various bodies controlling these open spaces have a definite 'demarcation attitude' which has to be managed, however this should not be unworkable.

My experience with DEC has been that they would respond with assistance, particularly if the community was involved through volunteers. I know that they also attempt to prosecute illegal dumpers and have done so with success. With assistance from the public, more convictions may be possible.

I am sure the City of Armadale would also be supportive of a joint effort with the community. Is there an active community body, which has an interest in this subject, that I may be able to join and support?

If the Roleystone - Karragullen locals and the respective Governing bodies became united and determined to cleanup the area and do their utmost to identify the vandals we could return our surrounding region to pristine bush and parkland, rather than the dumping ground which it may become.

I certainly hope so.

The ridiculousness of the paths is not restricted to Tyers Rd but extends around to Welch.



Vic Every 27/2/1921 - 7/11/2013 The Passing Of A Pioneer

Vic was born in Fremantle on 27/2/1921. As a young boy he worked with his father prospecting in the goldfields and later they lived and worked a farm at Narambean.

At the age of 14 he left to walk to Perth. He got to Yellowdine from where he hitched a ride to Perth.

In 1940 at age 19 he joined the Royal Australian Navy and was in active sea service for 12 years serving in several ships both during and following the war. In 1941 he was drafted to the Corvette HMAS Bendigo in which he saw service in Darwin, Indonesia, Singapore and New Guinea. The ship was in the thick of the action encountering enemy aircraft and submarines. It was on the Bendigo he met his "go ashore oppo" and lifelong mate Jack (Tex) Proctor after whom he was many years later to name his little fox terrier, Tex. Despite Tex living in Sydney they remained close mates until Tex passed away earlier

In 1952 he transferred to the Naval Dockyard Police where he served until he left the Navy in 1968.

He wasn't ashore for long before he joined the Commonwealth Dept of Transport Lighthouse tender MV Cape Don, servicing lights off the coast of Western Australia and Northern Territory, which he served on until retirement 10 years later.

As a young man in Fremantle he lived next door to a girl named Gwen Pearce but being 9 years older he never really noticed her until one day she had become a beautiful 18 year old young woman. Wearing his best

> dress uniform and armed with some fresh crayfish he went calling and the rest is history.

> After a short romance (all chaperoned of course,

Gwen's father knew what sailors could be like) they were married in St Johns Church in Fremantle and they enjoyed 65 happy years together.

In 1952 they bought a block of land in Roleystone and subsequently built the home in which they have lived ever since and raised their family.

Vic became actively involved in the Roleystone community, joining the Volunteer Bushfire Brigade in 1953. He was a member for over ten years and Fire Control Officer for three.

He was a keen cricketer and played for Roleystone Karragullen Cricket Člub for six years but was an active member for much longer. He was involved in establishing Cross Park after the council levelled it in 1963 (prior to this it was on the same gradient as Jarrah Road).

As RKCC groundsman he supervised watering the newly planted grass with hand shifted sprinklers and hoses which took a couple of years before it could be honestly called a playing field. He was named RKCC best clubman twice and was awarded life membership in 1975.

Vic was also a tireless worker for the Roleystone Country Club, being a foundation member in 1972 and debenture

He looked after the gardens for many years and established the beautiful roses that grow alongside the bowling greens today.

He played bowls for the Club and was a member of the infamous "F Troop" consisting of: Vic, Bill Campbell, Phil Moffit and Trevor Cook.

Vic was made the first Life Member of the club in 1983.

His wife and family wish to express their appreciation for all the messages of condolence and sympathy. Gwen would also like to thank Steve, Gary and staff of Roleystone Pharmacy for all of their help over the years.

On the corner of Holden and Raeburn Roads (near the roundabout) the Every's house outer fence boasted a tremendous passion fruit vine which was always laden with fruit. The girls and their walking companion John VT (his name is hidden in the depths of time) lusted after this fruit, but they were law abiding citizens and were not tempted to steal even one passion fruit.

That is until Fiona Bettenay discovered a 'hidden law' that stated that owners only owned items on the inside of their property. Anything that was on the outside of the property was available to 'the common man'. (This was far before the invention of the Internet so she must have found and interpreted this law from one of the many books that she was always reading.) This would of course apply to fruit if it fell onto the ground outside the property. Fiona announced this wondrous discovery to Linda and John VT. The implications were obvious – the passion fruit were ours for the taking!

His involvement with Community was always strong and he had many years in a senior organisational role with Youth Hostels Australia. 



A CHANCE MEETING

I was born and raised in Switzerland and grew up in a very close knit-family. Although my husband and I have lived in Australia for 32 years, 25 of these in Roleystone, I am still very close to my mother, sisters and brother, who all still reside in Switzerland. In April 2012 my oldest sister was diagnosed with lung cancer stage 4, meaning the cancer had spread to her bones and liver. The whole family was in shock and disbelief and rallied to her support. I went to Switzerland in May/June 2012 to see her through a series of Chemotherapies.

Initially, she responded well to the Chemo, the cancer was reduced and she felt generally well again. But sadly this did not last and in September 2012 the cancer was back, bigger and more aggressive.

Her Oncologist by then had given up on her and sent her home to spend her last days with family.

But we as a family were not ready to give up. My younger sister, married to a Doctor herself, had a friend who used to work in a clinic in Germany. This clinic is a Hyperthermia Centre specializing in integrated Oncology and in treating the patient, as opposed to treating the cancer like most Oncologist would.

But this story is not about the clinic and the treatment there, although I am a big supporter of it. This story is about how small this world is. Refer to http://www.bad-salzhausen.de/ if you would like more information about this treatment.

Being in Australia, half way around the world, I could not go and visit my sister on weekends or evenings as the rest of my family could. We spoke regularly on Skype, which helped us both, but was not enough. So I

decided to accompany my sister to this clinic in Bad Salzhausen, Germany and be with her through the treatment there.

I flew to Switzerland at the end of November 2012 to pick up my sister's car and drive the 300km to the clinic. The treatment would take three weeks.

The clinic provides accommodation and meals for both, the patient and the support person. They have a big buffet for lunch and for dinner, where everybody could help themselves to what and how much they would like to eat.

There were tables for four to eight people. One would get to talk to other patients and their supporters, share stories and experiences, good or bad.

So there we were, my sister and I, sitting at a table having dinner. Another patient approached us and asked if he could join us for dinner.

He spoke with the widest Aussie accent one could think of! Naturally, I laughed and asked where in Aussie-Land he came from. 'From Adelaide,' was the answer.

How small is the world, I thought. Here I am in Germany, supporting my sick sister and I meet an Australian!

But this is not the end of the story!

We spoke more and I told him that I, too, lived in Australia, although I was originally from Switzerland. Naturally, he wanted to know where in Australia I lived. So I said Perth, WA - why bother mentioning small Roleystone at this stage!

Next thing I know, the lady on the table behind us turns around and said:

"I heard you mentioning Perth. Me and my daughter here, we also come from Perth!'

Well, of course I want to know where in Perth she and her daughter come from! I could not believe what I heard next: "we live in Roleystone!" I almost fell off my

I travel half way around the world to accompany my sister to a small clinic in country Germany, and I meet someone from Roleystone!

From then on Carol and her daughter Kayley, my sister and I, spent time together to go sightseeing and visit places around the clinic. The two of them even came to stay with us for a weekend at my sister's and mother's place in Basel, Switzerland.

Sadly, my sister passed away in April 2013. The treatment in Germany gave her another four months of quality life, but could not cure her as her cancer was too far progressed.

But my friendship with Carol and her family is still going strong and I am happy to say that Carol is in remission and doing well. We occasionally meet for lunch or tea or coffee and chat endlessly!

From the Archives Who Owns The Water?

This is an extract from The West Australian, October 29th, 1912. It is a reported speech by the Attorney General, Mr T. Walker, at the opening of The Kelmscott Show in 1912....,

.... Agriculturalists are the makers of nations. Not the statesmen, however valuable they might be, nor the members of the Parliament, the roads boards or the councils.

The nation builders are those who, on the land, provide the cereals and general sources of food supply. The Government is more-interested in hearing of the triumphs of the agriculturists than in reading of the great cattle kings and big-holding landlords.

The object of the Government is to cover the State with a population that will produce, not merely a sufficiency for local requirements, but a great surplus for the markets of the world. A surplus that will, by a great bridge of commerce, encircle the world.

While the local producers think they are but working for their own livelihood, they are indeed bringing the State into closer touch with the Empire and the commerce of the world. The great aim of the present Government is to make all the community helpful to every section of the community.

The Government desires to see a flourishing population of horticulturists and agriculturists and to see the establishment of dairy farming and other farms across Western Australia.

He (the Attorney General) was thankful that it was possible for him to say that there was every possibility of a bountiful harvest this year. Such a harvest as would give them every faith in a country, which so far they had just scratched and feebly tested. A country which would yet be one of the finest countries in the world in the proximity of life's bounties.

The Government to this end is anxious to help, and for that reason the new Irrigation Bill had been introduced.

It is no new experiment that the Government is trying, it has been

found to work well in New South Wales and in other countries where it has been tested.

The principle is that the Government did not desire the smallest amount of the water that Nature has blessed the country with, to run to waste or be unduly monopolised.

The Government

desires, by control of all rivers, lakes, lagoons, and other fresh water supplies, whether natural or artificial, to make the earth more fertile. And surely those present would admit that that was a desirable thing.

The Government recognises in the Bill that no individual has the right to the whole of any river or stream; that a man with land on a river or stream has no right to dam or stop the water, preventing it flowing down through a neighbour's holding; that he has no right to pollute the water of such stream or river; that he has a right to his supply of water from it for stock and other necessary purposes, but that if he wanted more than was justly allocated to him, he would have to pay for it.

Such a landholder in the meantime would also have the benefit of the irrigation scheme. There might be some instances where, under the provisions of the Bill, some slight injustice might be done to landholders. Provision however, was made for compensation.

He (the Attorney-General) could not conceive that any injustice to speak of would be perpetrated under the provisions of the Bill. It was, he would say, however, a measure aimed at the general good, by making more fertile the land and improving the water supplies by removing any monopolising of water. He congratulated the Society on the excellence of the display, and had special pleasure in formally declaring the 22nd Kelmscott Agricultural Show Open.








ANNUAL ART EXHI





In a major emergency, you might be asked, or choose, to evacuate your property. If that happens, Fire-fighters, police and other agencies would like to know if you've got the message about the emergency and chosen to leave.

You can help them by leaving a weighted-down Green Bag at the front of your driveway when you go.

That Green Bag indicates to authorities that people at a property have already left for a safer place.

You should put the bag at the front of your driveway, where it can be clearly seen by Police or other emergency authorities from

the road and won't obstruct any emergency vehicle. You should use something heavy, like a brick, rock or filled water bottle. If you don't have such an item, tie your Green Bag to your letterbox or a post. Officers can then prioritise checks at other, non-flagged properties, potentially saving time and lives! Remember, it's far safer to evacuate early, rather than leaving it to the last minute.

So get Fire Ready and have your Green Bag ready in your Emergency Evacuation kit. Most

folk already have a Green Bag - if you do not, these Green Bags are available from all Coles and IGA stores. For more information there will be a meeting at the Roleystone Fire Station in Jarrah Rd at 7.30pm on Thursday 12 December. Everyone is Welcome. Make 'Saving Lives' Your Priority!





What a wonderful morning we enjoyed, at Pam and Stans' beautiful garden here in Roleystone.

The moment we drove into the yard I was spellbound at the beautiful Pierre de Ronstadt rose climbing up the corner of the house. It was fully in flower and looked crisp and lovely. Then I noticed the healthy lush camellia bushes and the Flanders poppies just finishing the flowering season with so many seed pods ripe for sowing next year.

The garden had hedges of low alyssum, Chinese tallow trees surrounded by pea straw, flourishing in the front garden. The calibracheos in the urns at the top of the stairs set the pattern for the formality of the garden and starting to bloom were the structural plantings or agapanthus and the gardenias.

The Myrsine African hedge lined the lawn with tall roses behind, then the scene changed to be less formal with many different native plants and over the inner driveway were many Arcanthus mollis still brandishing the spears. Around the side of the front garden was a mesh of large shrubs that had been planted to replace a horrendous, Japanese pepper corn, that had previously dominated the yard but had been disposed of because of its foul habit of suckering.

A range of different trees made a border to the block including: conifers, plumbago, philadelphus, and Claret and Desert Ash.

Up the back of the yard near the swimming pool but outside the pool yard was the most magnificent Prunus elvins, which Pam bemoaned its suckering.

I have always loved the ones that sucker because they look so natural and the suckers grow readily when transplanted.

Margaret gave me a pink version some years ago when we visited her lovely garden. It thrives and has already given me a couple of suckering plants.



On the 22nd of November, our current production, Peter Pan, opened to an almost full house.


Kids and adults both delighted in the wonderful tale of the boy who never grew up.

The winning 30 second commercial will now be screened at Armadale Grand Cinema before each film during the summer.


The Judges led by a panel of leading WA health





Well, what a year it's been. At the start of 2013 we had 26 members and this has steadily increased to reach the magic 50!

Shed equipment has built up to make the woodworking section fully stocked with almost all the tools we need, whilst the metalwork section has grown from practically nothing to a well equipped workshop. All this progress would not have been possible without the generous support of our sponsors, the Roleystone-Karragullen Bendigo Community Bank *, Fidock Real Estate, The Roleystone Family Medical Centre, The Roleystone Community Family Centre and the Roleystone Recreation Centre. Along with our sponsors' donations of money and services, gifts too numerous to mention of equipment from individuals and businesses in and around Roleystone have made our progress rapid and enjoyable.

As many will know, we are situated at the old Roleystone Primary School through the indulgence of the WA Education Authority, to whom we are eternally grateful. 

Astrolonomical Highlights December & January Greg Lowe Perth Observatory

Remember all the hype that was written and spoken about the supposed end of the world when the last Mayan calendar cycle ran out at the solstice a year ago? And what happened? Nothing. Well done - you've survived Armageddon by 12 months.

I wonder what the next End of Days silliness will be. The summer solstice this year is on December 22nd: longest days, shortest nights - not so great for astronomers.

Venus is coming to the end of a 7-month period of dominating the western evening sky as the "evening star". It'll set earlier and earlier this month, remaining in view just long enough to do a turn as the Christmas star, then will vanish into the glare of the sun by New Year. It passes between Earth and the sun on January 11th. At the end of January it reappears as a morning object and will be the "morning star" until September.

As Venus slips from the evening sky, Jupiter comes along to take on the mantle of brightest starlike object. In early December the giant planet rises in the ENE around 9:45pm. By mid-month it's rising at about 8:45, and by New Year it's visible in the ENE at dusk. On January 6th Jupiter's at opposition, i.e. on the opposite side of Earth from the sun. This means it's as near and as bright as it can be, and is visible all

night. Perth Observatory's summer holiday viewing programme will feature Jupiter as the "star of the show".

Mars is the next planet to come into view, rising in the east at about 1:40am in early December, 1:15am mid-month, and 12:30am by New Year. Daybreak finds it in the NE sky throughout December. Its orange colour helps with identification. Through January the rising time keeps getting earlier - about midnight in the middle of the month, and 11:30pm at month's end, by which time it's in the north at dawn.

Saturn's poised to reappear in the morning sky, rising just to the south of east at daybreak (about 4:15am) in early December, then about a half-hour earlier each week: 3:15am mid-month, and 2:15am by New Year. In January it continues to rise about 30 minutes earlier, week by week. By the end of January it's coming up just after midnight.

The major moon phases

In December: new moon on the 3rd, first guarter the 9th, full moon the 17th, last quarter the 25th. In January: new moon on the 1st, first quarter the 8th, full moon the 16th, last quarter the 24th, and new moon the 31st.

Wild Gossip: Wildlife Carer Challenges

I have been receiving numerous enquiries about baby birds and lots are being brought to my house which is often quite unnecessary.

If you see a feathered baby bird on the ground, watch from a distance to see if the parents are in attendance and feeding it. If dogs or cats may be a problem and cannot be confined then the baby bird will need to be gently picked up and placed on a nearby tree branch (Y shaped is good) and observed from a distance to ensure the parent birds are attending it. It is amazing to see a parent bird come to a young bird on a tree branch and use its wings to flick it back up to the nest and safety.

Unfeathered young birds will need an artificial nest, which can be as simple as a padded hanging basket, placed in a nearby tree with a warmth source such as a warm wheat pack or warm water bottle inside. This should be observed from a distance and if a parent bird does not return in a few hours your local carer should be contacted for advice.

Injured young birds will need to be gently picked up and taken to your local carer or shelter.

Sometimes young birds can be caught out of their normal time frame eg a magpie at night or a Tawny during the day. In this case the bird should be gently picked up and placed in a warm, dark, quiet place. The bird should be returned as close as

possible to the original location at the appropriate time – morning for magpies and other diurnal birds and evening for Tawnys and other nocturnal birds. If in doubt contact your local carer for advice. I recently had an injured, pouch young, joey brought to me by the couple who had hit mum and she had run off leaving the joey behind. I took the joey into care overnight and made a vet appointment the following day. Sadly the joey's back was broken in two places so it had to be euthanized. I was amazed to be charged \$50 for this as normally wildlife consultations are free and I only pay for medication. I contacted the couple concerned and informed them of the sad news and they also expressed disbelief at being charged! The couple said that they would pay and would drop the money in my mailbox the following day. That was three weeks ago so I guess it is not coming! I have retired for health reasons and my husband has been unemployed for eight weeks so this money had to be paid from our savings. My concern is that with limited savings, whilst I can usually pay animal food bills and for medication, the extra burden of paying for euthanasia might make it impossible for me to continue. This would be sad as I love our wildlife and all wildlife deserves our love and care.
